

HARDING SEEKING BULL MOOSE AD

Washington, June 17.—(U. P.)—A movement to unite solidly behind the presidential candidacy of Senator Warren G. Harding former Bull Mooseers as well as more conservative Republicans was under way today.

The decision to start such a movement was apparently reached by Harding himself and is the first important one of his presidential campaign.

Walter F. Brown, Toledo, who was active in the Bull Moose movement in 1912, has been assigned the job of winning the active support of all progressives. He was prepared to go out on his mission today.

"I think you will find that the progressives will be united behind Senator Harding," Brown said.

Salt Lake City, June 17.—(U. P.)—The newspaper special train carrying over 40 newspaper men to the San Francisco convention passed through here late yesterday afternoon after a stop-over of several hours.
