

MYSTERIOUS GIRL WHO CALLED ON ELWELL IS FOUND

Albany, N. Y., June 19.—(U. P.)—The mysterious girl who called at the home of Joseph Bowne Elwell, slain whist expert, on the morning that he was found dying in a chair by his housekeeper, was found today on the Lake George steamer Morion.

She is attractive and gave her name as Florence Eltonson. She said she met Elwell last winter at Palm Beach, and was often in his company. According to her story, she received a letter from Elwell while he was still at Louisville, Ky., and she was at Asbury Park.

"I told him I would be at Lake George this summer," she said, in telling the story, "and he said that would be nice, as he would be at Saratoga."

"Between 10 and 11 o'clock Thursday morning I called him on the phone and he called me on the phone the next morning at 8:30. I got into New York city at the Pennsylvania station at 11:10. When he did not call I became worried. He had always been punctual before. I called Elwell's house on the phone. The housekeeper answered. She said Elwell had met with a terrible accident and she seemed very nervous."

The girl told of having gone to Elwell's house, where she was told that he had been murdered. She immediately returned to Lake George, she said.

POLICE ADMIT FAILURE TO FIND ANY TANGIBLE CLUE
New York, June 19.—(U. P.)—After nine days of investigation of the murder of Joseph Bowne Elwell, whist expert and race horse owner, the police tonight admitted themselves baffled and without a tangible clue.

They have turned back to a theory of suicide, although apparently this theory is not supported by the known facts.

Even upon the theory that the revolver with which the crime was committed was removed after the discovery of the body, the police are faced with the fact that the weapon has never been discovered.

The impending arrest of at least one person as a material witness was tonight hinted at by the authorities. The identity of this person was not made public.

Passing over the suicide theory the district attorney's force tonight believed that possibly as many as four persons who know the identity of the slayer are keeping silent because they fear to bring disgrace to some young woman. This conjecture was advanced by Assistant District Attorney Joyce.

That the .45 calibre revolver, with which Elwell's life was taken, was at least two feet from him when fired pointblank at his forehead, was tonight definitely stated by the police. The distance was determined by the lack of powder marks.

Puyallup, Wash., 6371; increase since 1910, 1727 or 27 per cent. Topeka, Kans., 59,022; increase since 1910, 6338 or 1.45 per cent.

FIGHT CONTINUES AT LONDONDERRY

Troops Patrol Streets; Several Hurt in Clash of Unionists and Nationalists.

Londonderry, June 19.—(U. P.)—Troops patrolled streets here tonight following factional fights between Unionists and Nationalists in which several persons were injured and many shots exchanged. A fight was raging in the Unionist section of Fountain street when military authorities interfered. The fight was precipitated when a crowd of Sinn Feiners entered the Unionist quarters.

Boeing Plane Comes Here on Last Lap of Triangular Journey

A Boeing plane, piloted by Herbert Munter with F. W. Strang and H. E. Munter as passengers, landed at Lewis and Clarke aviation field at 8:25 Saturday from Yakima, and hopped off at 1:30 p. m. for Seattle, the last lap of a triangular journey they have taken to determine the feasibility of using the airplane for commercial purposes, and to cause establishment of landing fields.

Munter arrived in Seattle at 8 o'clock Saturday night after a trip of an hour and 55 minutes from Portland. With a throttled motor and a stiff opposing wind, the plane with its three passengers and 150 pounds baggage, made the flight from Yakima to Portland in one hour and 55 minutes. The plane started from Seattle, making the entire distance over the mountains to Spokane in a non-stop flight at an altitude of 10,750 feet at an average of 100 miles an hour. The altitude limit for the plane is 20,000 feet.

Hearst Makes Call For Progressives

San Francisco, June 19.—William Randolph Hearst issued a statement tonight in which he called for the forming of a new party to be made up of Progressives who are dissatisfied with the Republican platform and candidates and who see no hope that the Democrats will provide a medium through which they may express their views. Hearst declares that circumstances make immediate action imperative and he urges that a new "Declaration of political independence" be framed in a "new independence hall."

ALLIED COUP TO CURB TURK NOW BEING DISCUSSED

Lloyd George and Millerand Will Hold Conference on Turkish Situation to Paris Treaty.

London, June 19.—(U. P.)—Menacing developments in Turkey where nationalists are opposing the enforcement of the peace treaty, are reported to have been the chief reason for the sudden planning of a Hythe conference between Premier Lloyd George and Premier Millerand for tonight and tomorrow.

Millerand left Paris a day earlier than expected. He is coming direct to Hythe, the Kent watering place, where Lloyd George and his staff will be awaiting him. On Monday both will proceed to Boulogne, where the conference will also include representatives of Italy, Japan, Belgium and Greece. It was authoritatively stated here that the conference was called by reason of serious reports that Admiral de Robeck, at Constantinople, is convinced the allied position in the straits is menaced by Mustafa Kemal Pasha's nationalists, numbering 40,000, who are reported to be occupying almost the whole of Anatolia and are believed to be preparing for a great general attack on the allies.

TO CONSIDER METHOD OF MAKING GERMANY PAY

New York, June 19.—The delegates of the five allies will meet at Boulogne on Monday will have before them for final settlement the method of collecting the German indemnity and its division as their principal problem. How to come to terms with Russia for the resumption of trade relations will also be considered.

All efforts by the allies to reach a common agreement on the German indemnity and Russian trade relations have heretofore failed. At Boulogne, a basis for a final settlement must be found if European statesmanship is to escape the charge of being unable to handle its own problems of victory.

The presence at Boulogne of new Italian Foreign Minister Count Sforza means Italy intends to press her newly formed claims for a larger share of the German indemnity than she had previously been allotted. France's attitude of inexorable opposition to the resumption of trade relations with Russia will isolate Premier Millerand at Boulogne if he still clings to this policy. The Belgian representatives at Boulogne are under instructions to second the British position. Italy also is favorable to the British plan of negotiating with the Bolshevik trade commissioner, Krasin. Japan, of course, will support her ally, France cannot hope to prevail against this combination.

The question of revising the Turkish peace treaty is certain to be referred to at Boulogne. On this matter, France holds the winning cards. The French are demanding that greater consideration be shown Turkish nationalist feeling. France's real purpose in taking this attitude is to prevent a paramount influence being established in Asia-Minor by Great Britain and Great Britain's protégé, Greece. Serious objection is now being faced in England to the enormous commitments of Lloyd George in Asia-Minor.
