OVERWORK HASTENS DEATH OF DENTIST

Isaac Tipton Mason, who died June 5, was born at Knoxville, Tenn., July 21, 1860. He came to Oregon as a lad of 16. He was educated at the University of Oregon and practiced dentistry for 29 years in Salem, Dallas and Portland.

He was a member of the Masonic fraternity, having joined Jennings lodge of Dallas when 21 years old. He was past high priest of Ainsworth chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Dallas, past patron of Camella chapter, Order Eastern Star, of Portland, and a member of the Oregon Shrine No. 1, order of the White Shrine of Jerusalem.

His last illness was brought on by overwork. He is survived by a widow, Mrs. Minnie S. Mason, 798 Kerby street, and a son, Dr. Clay Mason of Klamath Falls.

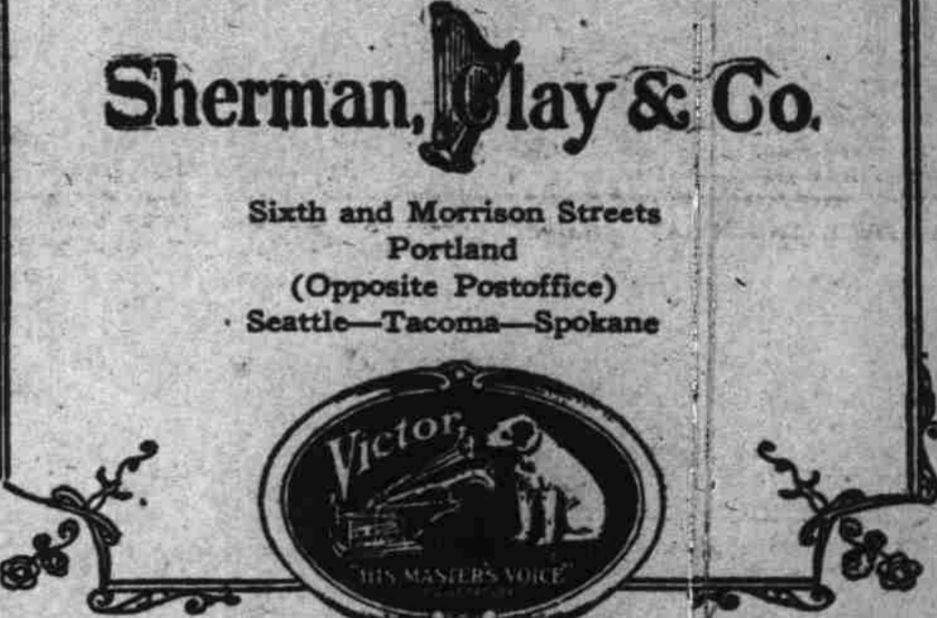
