

LONG JUMP AND ARTILLERY TEAM DRILL FEATURED

A new ring event, the Crafion long jump, the musical chair drill put on by the artillery team from Oregon Agricultural college, and the pony drills by children under 16, were features of Wednesday's matinee at the horse show. New features are promised for tonight's show at 8:30 o'clock in Multnomah field. Some of the finest stock in the Northwest is being shown, all classes doing exceedingly well in the performance of their stunts.

FLYING FOX WINNER

The Crafion long jump was won by Flying Fox, driven by W. J. Sanderson, after a spirited contest in which 25 animals were entered. This contest was for the Imperial hotel \$100 stake. In this event Claude D. Starr was thrown from his horse, but uninjured. The pony class and pony jump blue ribbons were won by Marquisa, with Miss Sara Jane Talbot in the saddle. A few wild west cowboy stunts were shown and a spirited drill was also put on by Pendleton riders. The North Portland Stockyard stake of \$200 in the cowboy event was captured by Sir Donald, with James H. Lemons astride. F. W. Wilson of Kerk's temple, Reno, a horse fancier, assisted in judging Wednesday's show. He will assist Judge C. W. Green this evening. J. D. Farrell exhibited his prize winning stepper and jumper, "Old Glory" and "Premier." They will be shown again tonight.
