Gresham is to have another celebration of the Fourth of July on Monday, July 5, and it is expected to attract larger attendance than that of last year when fully 30,000 were present.

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M'CAMANT WILL ATTEMPT TO TELL WHY HE DID IT

Wallace McCamant, so it is announced, will undertake, at 8 o'clock this evening, before the meeting of the Roosevelt Republican club at the Central library to explain why he violated his promise to the people to vote for "the candidate who wins out at the Oregon primary," when he bolted the popular instruction for Johnson at the Chicago convention.

McCament, while a candidate for delegate at large to the convention, printed in the voters' pamphlet, over his own name, and thus promised the 200,000 and more Republican voters of the state, that "I have avoided committing myself to any candidate for president in order that I might be in a better position to support the candidate who wins out in the Oregon primary."

After his election, and after Johnson had "won out at the Oregon primary," McCament announced that he would repudiate the instruction of the voters of his party and cast his vote for Wood at Chicago. He attempted to expiate this repudiation of his promise made in the voters' pamphlet by contending that he had "repeatedly" informed "hundreds of voters" as he campaigned throughout the state that he would not vote for Johnson, arguing that this private word of mouth, passed to a few persons here and there in his wanderings over the state, absolved him from his official and widespread promise printed over his signature in the voters' pamphlet. Tonight he will attempt, according to announcement, to square his performances with his broken promise.

Others who will speak during the evening will be Conrad P. Olson, Dow V. Walker and Hamilton Johnstone, all delegates to the Chicago convention. Walker was one of the delegates who repudiated his pledge to the voters by favoring the Johnson cause while it was in the ascendant by switching to Wood on the third ballot.

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Work at Gold Hill Plant Held Up by Shriners' Specials

Gold Hill, Or., June 28.—Owing to the movement of the Shriners' specials, the Beaver Portland cement plant here was practically idle last week.

When the first Shriners train passed through, en route to Portland, local freight stopped to give right of way and, since the cement plant depends on the Southern Pacific to transport its limestone from the quarry at Zachar, two miles below Gold Hill, to bunkers at the mill, the plant ran out of rock.

The Gold Hill plant, since installing its new driving mechanism on the rotary furnace, has increased production to 1100 barrels per day, a figure in excess of the rated capacity.

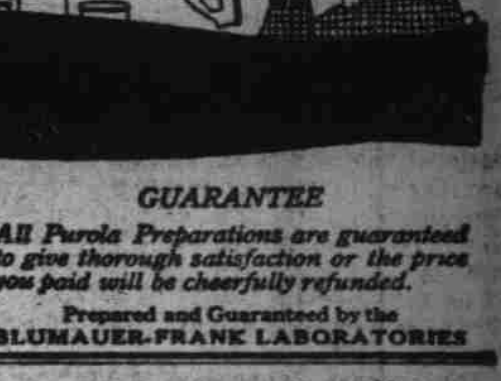
