

DUBINSKY MURDER CASE SUBJECT OF CONFERENCE HELD

Deputy District Attorney Butler and Sheriff Wilson of Clackamas county came to Portland today and this forenoon held a conference at District Attorney Evans' office on the Dubinsky murder case. The second confession of Moore was read and Miss Evelyn Shodahl, the young woman who is said to have taken rides with Moore in the Dubinsky automobile after the murder, was brought before them for questioning.

City Detectives Hellyer and Leonard were also present. No information was given out as to the general results of this conference.

Tom Garland, attorney for Russell Brake, who declared he was not present when the murder was committed, made formal application to Butler for permission to take witnesses for Brake before the young man in the county jail, so that they might identify him, but this was refused by Butler. He also asked for permission to read the second confession of Moore, which was also denied.

ATTORNEY'S FEE FIXED IN CITY'S CONDEMNATION SUIT

In the condemnation suit of the city against the Versteeg Brick company for land desired for playground and park purposes, the court, after the verdict, fixed the attorney's fee at \$1250. The city of Portland on Tuesday filed a motion to reconsider and reduce the amount of the defendant attorney's fees, on the ground that the trial was simple and required no special preparation, that it took less than three days' time and that \$200 a day, or \$600, would be liberal compensation. It is also set up that the city voluntarily offered the defendant \$30,000 for the land before the trial and that the jury award was \$7500 more, so that, if the attorney's fee is based on a percentage this base should be only the \$7200 instead of \$7500.

WOMAN CLERK LOSES FIGHT FOR HER REINSTATEMENT

Circuit Judge McCourt Monday quashed the writ of review in the action of Laura Kennedy, who sought reinstatement as clerk of the municipal civil service commission. This action by the court was taken on the grounds that the petition was insufficient to sustain the writ. Judge McCourt stated that a hearing before the mayor was offered the petitioner, and that the city charter has no statement requiring that specific charges shall be made against discharged employees and that only one in general terms is necessary, while there is no specific provision that it is not necessary to give a trial or hearing.

SENTENCED FOR RECEIVING STOLEN AUTOMOBILE TIRES

Eight months in the county jail is the sentence which Circuit Judge McCourt imposed on Ralph Stark Monday, who pleaded guilty to receiving stolen automobile tires. Stark was out on parole from sentence of five years in the state penitentiary for burglary, but the fact that the property taken was all recovered and that Stark has a wife and little baby as well as an invalid mother and sister dependent upon him moved the court not to revoke the parole, but to simply give the jail sentence.

Husband Has "Come Back" In the divorce suit of Marie W. Magnuson against Carl E. Magnuson, the defendant today filed an answer and cross-complaint in which he alleges he has turned over to his wife more than

\$10,000 of his earnings. Magnuson says he has had but one new suit of clothes in nine years and that his wife insisted on his wearing garments discarded by tenants. He asks for an order of the court restraining her from selling any of the property pending the determination of her suit.

Oregon May Get Doyle Estate

After hospital and funeral expenses are paid, the remainder of the estate of John Doyle, who died at St. Vincent's hospital June 27, probably will escheat to the state of Oregon. He has no known heirs. Circuit Judge Taswell Tuesday appointed Levi Johnson, who was a close friend of the deceased, as executor of the estate, which consists of \$700 in cash in the State Bank of Portland, a trunk, a valise and a watch valued at \$15.

Wife Charges Cruelty

Mrs. Gertrude Robertson today filed a suit for divorce from W. H. Robertson, charging cruelty. She says that Robertson is a professional diver and earns from \$50 to \$75 a day and that recently he has had steady employment at between \$40 and \$70 a day, but that he has squandered all that he gets and she has had to depend on relatives to keep herself and their three children.

McKim Starts Damage Suit

Wilson T. McKim filed a suit against the Portland Railway, Light & Power company Tuesday in which he seeks judgment for \$2422 for damages alleged to have been sustained when he and his motorcycle were struck by a streetcar at Buckley avenue April 16 last.

Roadmaster William Etchele today recommended to the county commissioners that provision be made for the construction of a number of turnouts on the Rocky Point road in order to facilitate the passing of vehicles.

Hearst Backs Reed For Head of Ticket Of New Third Party

Reed of Missouri, who was refused a delegate's seat at the Democratic national convention, may have an opportunity to head a third party ticket which will be named here within the next two weeks, according to backers of the proposed third party movement today.

In a statement issued today by A. W. Ricker, treasurer and member of the executive committee of the committee of Forty-eight, Reed was commended for the stand he has taken against the president.

Ricker's statement was issued following the publication here of a signed editorial by William Randolph Hearst, supporting Reed as a new party candidate.
