Lennon Store Leases More Room—Charles P. Berg, manager of Lennon's store, completed a deal Friday afternoon for the lease of the storeroom formerly occupied by the Lalane florist establishment at 311 Morrison street. The room adjoins the Lennon store on the west and will add 20 feet to the Morrison street frontage. The new quarters will be opened July 15 as an annex for the sale of waists, sweaters and underwear. On December 1 the 20 foot frontage now being used by the McPherson millinery store will also be added to the Lennon establishment.

Art Museum to Be Closed—The Art Museum will be closed July 4 and 5. It is open on all other days at the regular hours, week days 10 to 5 o'clock; Sundays, 2 to 5, and free the afternoons of Tuesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday. The special exhibition is of Chinese paintings, the gift of the late Charles L. Freer, with the jade, crystal and Oriental porcelains owned by the Art association, especially arranged to accompany these paintings.

Laborer Knocked Unconscious—C. E. Heller, 633 East Thirty-third street, was knocked unconscious Friday morning when a fellow laborer who was driving a stake Heller was holding missed his aim and struck Heller on the head. The accident occurred at the Brooklyn yards of the Southern Pacific, where the two men were employed. Heller was taken to Good Samaritan hospital by the Arrow Ambulance company. 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DALLAS MUST BE PACED ON HIGHWAY POINT, IF CIRCLES COURT

Dallas and Independence must be included on the route of the Pacific highway, but the state highway commission may continue work on the shorter route, which eliminates two cities, if it does not use money for the construction of the cut-off that was raised on bond issues.

This, in substance, is Circuit Judge McCourt's decision in the hearing on demand of the highway commission to the suit of Dallas and Independence city governments and individuals of those places to compel the commission to construct the Pacific highway through these towns.

DECISION SPEEDED UP
The hearing occurred Friday and was carried through until after 7 o'clock in the evening, in order that the decision of Judge McCourt might be given and appeals to the supreme court might be heard jointly with an appeal in a similar case in which Douglas county was trying to get the Pacific highway through its territory.

In his decision Judge McCourt said that no road could be properly designated the Pacific highway unless it runs through Dallas, and that in his opinion a stub road to this point would not be equivalent to the rest of the highway.

MUST INCLUDE DALLAS
He stated, however, that he believed the state highway commission is far better qualified than the state legislature to determine the route of a commercial highway, but as the legislature did designate Dallas as a point of the route it must be so located. He stated, however, that he did not think that the commission could be compelled to pave the road at this time and that a writ of mandamus could not properly be issued.

The law providing for the Pacific highway provides that roads of commercial importance contribute most to the development of the state shall be built first, said the court. These may be built by the commission through the use of available and voted for the specific purpose of constructing the Pacific highway.

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
