

WATER IS SOUGHT FOR IRRIGATION OF 2000-ACRE TRACT

Salem, July 7.—The construction of a storage reservoir covering 237 acres, a dam 22 feet high and 377 feet long and nine miles of main canal at an aggregate estimated cost of \$15,800 is provided in an application for water rights filed with the state engineer Tuesday by the Willow Valley Irrigation district of Linn county.

The application seeks permission to construct the reservoir and to appropriate 2500 acre feet of water from the east branch of Lost river for storage for the irrigation of approximately 2000 acres of land.

Other applications for water rights were filed as follows:

By C. P. Vase and John Valen of Waldo, construction of a small reservoir for the storage of water from the right hand fork of Althouse creek for mining purposes in Josephine county.

By W. W. Hiser of Newberg, water from an unnamed spring for use in steam boilers.

By F. S. Abel of Grants Pass, water from Louse creek for irrigation of a small tract in Josephine county.

By Frank J. Parent, James Thompson, E. J. Davis and Henry Lloyd of Free water, water from Little Walla Walla river for irrigation of 72 acres near Free water.

By Oscar Burnside of Keating, waste water for irrigation of 50 acres in Baker county.

By E. E. Fowell of Hood River, water from an unnamed spring for the irrigation of a small tract, development of one horsepower and domestic use.

By R. H. Zimmerman of Strassel, Wash., water from a spring for irrigation and domestic purposes.

By J. V. Hals of Portland, water from Big creek and Buck creek for power and domestic purposes in Multnomah county.

By W. P. Counts of Grants Pass, water from Rogue river for use in steam boilers.

By G. B. Farmer of Grants Pass, wa-

ter from unnamed springs for the irrigation of a small tract in Josephine county.

By George F. Young of North Powder, water from North Powder river for irrigation of 62.5 acres in Union county.

Application for authority to construct its tracks across several public highways was filed with the public service commission Tuesday by the Willamina & Grand Ronde Railway company, a new corporation which is constructing a line from Willamina, Yamhill county, along the Yamhill river west to Dentley, Polk county.

The appeal in the case of S. H. Rockhill against the state highway commission over the location of the state highway through Douglas county was argued before the supreme court Tuesday morning. Rockhill won his fight for an injunction against the construction of the Canyonville cut-off in the Douglas county circuit court and the state appealed. J. M. Devera and Jay Bowerman represented the state, with Orest and Rice of Roseburg appearing for Rockhill.

Investigation of Toledo Postoffice Robbery Is Made

Toledo, Or., July 7.—Postoffice Inspector Clement of Portland, checking up on the Sunday postoffice robbery found the robbers secured \$100 in cash and \$200 in stamps. Several hundred dollars in War Savings Stamps and a \$5 bill were overlooked.

The robbers used more explosive than necessary, wrecking the safe. The explosion was heard by many who thought it merely early shooting for the Fourth. Several hundred dollars' worth of valuable papers, belonging to Postmaster Gaither, were taken which will be of no value to the robbers. Comment expressed the opinion that the job was the work of professional yegmen. Entrance to the building was gained by jimmying a rear window.

Herd of Elk Freed By State Damages Crops of Rancher

Salem, July 7.—Protected by a statute which provides a penalty of five years in the state prison for their slaughter, a herd of elk is eating A. Y. Myers, a rancher on the Little North Fork of the Santiam, 12 miles east of Mehama, "out of house and home," according to a complaint filed with Governor Olcott Tuesday by Myers' sons, A. B. and S. G.

The marauding herd includes six cows, three bulls and some calves and is part of the herd of 17 released by the state game commission in the Abiqua basin about a year ago. Shows in the basin, it is said, have driven the elk over the mountain in search of food. Settlers have no recourse under the law and must sit idly by while the ravenous animals devour their crops.

Seven acres of Myers' rye have already been destroyed and the herd has moved into a small patch of wheat, the brothers said. The animals are said to be tame, having been brought to Oregon from a zoo at Walla Walla, and cannot be frightened away.

Governor Olcott referred the complainants to A. E. Burghdoff of Portland, state game warden. It is probable that
