Precipitation has occurred at several stations in the Plains and Atlantic states. The following heavy rainfall is reported: Horn, S. D., 1.25; Des Moines, Iowa, 1.06. The weather is warmer over parts of the Rocky Mountain and Pacific Northwest and generally in other sections. Over the greater part of the country east of the Rocky mountains the temperature is below normal.

Peddles Drug, Breaks Parole—William E.
