

# MAN WHO PLANNED ENGLAND'S NAVY IS CALLED BY DEATH

Lord Fisher First to Realize the British Empire Would Be Saved or Lost in North Sea.

London, July 10.—Sir John Arbuthnot Fisher, Baron of Kelvinstone and the first sea lord of the admiralty that planned the British navy, trained its officers and inspired its strategy, died today. Lord Fisher was 79 years old.

Lord Fisher who, like Kitchener, was a great, silent, relentless worker, was not, in the strictest sense, an Englishman, for he was born in Ceylon. His father was Scotch and his mother, Sophie Lamb Fisher, a Singapore woman of high rank.

Lord Fisher was born in 1841 and entered the navy in 1854. He was a lieutenant in 1860, for his services in the Chinese war and the China war, in the latter of which he took part in the capture of the fort at Canton and Pisho. He was made a rear admiral in 1890, while he was director of naval ordnance, which office he held from 1886 to 1891, and partly in recognition of his services in command of the "Inflexible" at the bombardment of Alexandria in 1882. In 1891 he became superintendent of the Portsmouth dockyard, where he originated many improvements. He then became controller of the navy and lord of the admiralty and was made command in chief of the North American and West Indies stations, then commander in chief of the Mediterranean station. In 1902 he became second sea lord of the admiralty, and in 1904 was promoted to first sea lord of the admiralty. He retired from active service in 1910, but when the great European conflict broke out, and bitter criticism was aimed against Prince Louis of Battenberg because of his Austrian birth and parentage, the withdrawal of Prince Louis was the signal for a popular call for Lord Fisher to come to the fore.

**PLANNED ENGLISH NAVY**  
That there should have been a call for Lord Fisher's services at this crisis in the affairs of Great Britain was natural. It had been said that he was the same relation to the navy that Lord Kitchener did to the army. But the comparison really fell short of doing justice to the genius of Lord Fisher's achievements. More than to any other man, the efficiency of the modern British navy is due to him. He planned the ships, trained the officers, inspired the strategy which maintained the command of the North sea.

When Lord Fisher, over 60 years old, was given the highest prize of an English sailor's ambition, the position of first sea lord, he carried in his brain a well-thought out scheme of reorganization. He realized more than any other British commander that a navy of the new type was needed. He knew the necessity for training of officers. He was denounced for the sheer daring of the changes he introduced. He realized that the British empire would be saved or lost in the North Sea, and it was through his foresight that there were enough British vessels at hand when the great conflict broke out in 1914.

**ALWAYS HELD TONGUE**  
Lord Fisher was the one big man in the navy world who always held his tongue. In his long career he never spoke or wrote a word for publication. He had a horror of notoriety.

Lord Fisher married the daughter of a clergyman, Miss Frances Brougham, in 1866. Their son, Hon. Cecil Vasey Fisher, married in 1910 Miss Jane Morgan, daughter of Randall Morgan of Philadelphia. Lord Fisher came to America for the wedding. He was impressed with the bustle of American life. At the peace conference at Versailles in 1919 Baron Fisher was a British delegate. One who was present says that nobody made a greater impression than he upon the assembled diplomats. Lord Fisher has never hesitated to say that any war he might have to make would be hell. He cherished a bitter hatred of submarine vessels, and declared that if he caught the crew of a hostile submarine in time of war he would strangle them up to the yam and then hang them to a post. He was a man of iron will and a court martial afterward. This opinion he did not express in later years, when he saw that under the sea fighting had come to stay.

Lord Fisher had a profile like the bow of a battleship, rugged and sharply cut. There was a force of expression about his face that denoted the iron man of war. His figure was of medium size, active and even nervous.

His motto throughout his career was "The frontiers of England are the coasts of the enemy."

**British Prepare to Maintain Order on Boyne Anniversary**

London, July 10.—(U. P.)—Seven additional battalions of British troops have been ordered to Dublin and Belfast as a precaution against possible trouble when 20,000 Orangemen march in the parades in those cities Monday, the anniversary of the battle of the Boyne, it was learned on good authority tonight.

Five other battalions are being stationed in barracks at other cities in Ulster.

Military measures instituted both at Dublin and Belfast were supplemented by machine guns and howitzers. Both cities were enclosed in a cordon of British soldiers. Trenches were dug along side roads on the outskirts of town. Troops patrolled the main streets and barred wire entanglements were erected on all roads.

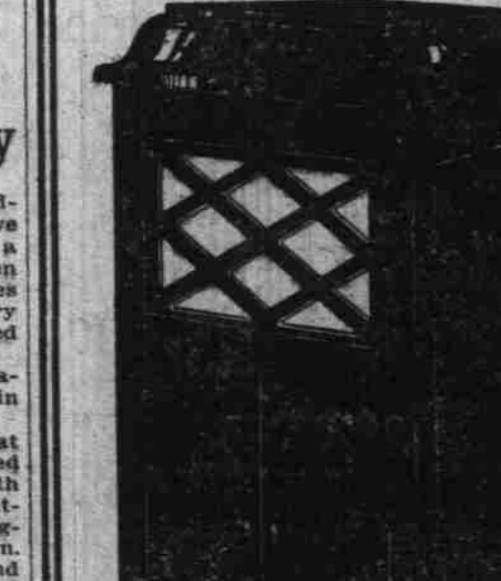
**STANDARD OFFERS HIGHER PRICES AT THE GAS WELLS**

# FORD NEWSPAPER DENOUNCES BOTH POLITICAL PARTIES

Inspired Editorial Interpreted to Mean Automobile Maker Gives Indorsement to Third Party.

Detroit, July 10.—(I. N. S.)—The Dearborn Independent, Henry Ford's international weekly, gave to the press an editorial under the caption, "Will Americans Stand for It?" which is taken by political observers as an emphatic indorsement of the third party now being formed at Chicago. The article in part follows:

"Disappointed in the utter absence of public spirit and responsibility in the national conventions of the Republican and Democratic parties, the independent American people have succumbed to a sense of deep disgust for partisan politics in general.

"The Republican convention was openly and abjectly dominated by the financial representatives of the powers that pull governmental influences like strings.

"The Democratic convention was, if anything, a degree worse, because there was an attempt made at San Francisco which had no parallel at Chicago—the convention was at least given a flaming opportunity to declare its adherence to the moral advance made by the American people with regard to the liquor traffic. But the hand of the defunct and disgraceful whiskey business was heavy upon the men who controlled that convention.

"There was no question, not even the League of Nations, which received the slavish attention which booze received. The whole convention resembled more 'hang over' from the saloon regime than a gathering of American citizens selected to formulate policies for the solution of the problems which harass the nation and the world.

"The defeat of McAdoo and the defeat of the movement to insert a wet plank in the platform were the two strong actions of the Democratic convention, but these were neutralized by the selection of Cox.

"There is now no choice whatever between Republican and Democratic candidates, and between Republican and Democratic platforms, or for that matter, between Republican and Democratic parties. The people have been treated like children; their highest hopes have been flouted; their best beliefs have been buried beneath mountains of partisan slurs and filth.

"There is no question, whatever, about the widespread, public disgust, the question is how will it emerge? Will it die down into apathy or will it flame forth into the protest of a citizens' movement with a citizens' candidate?

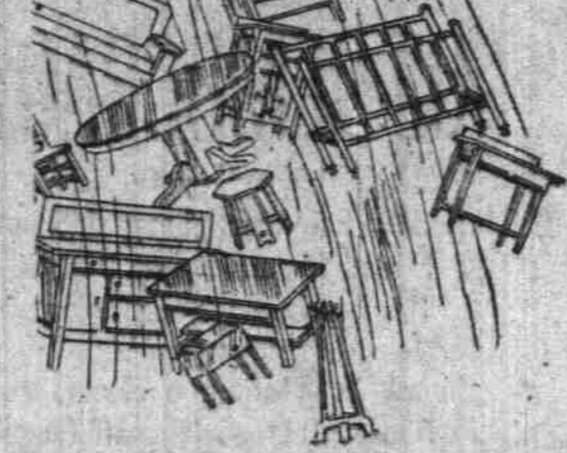

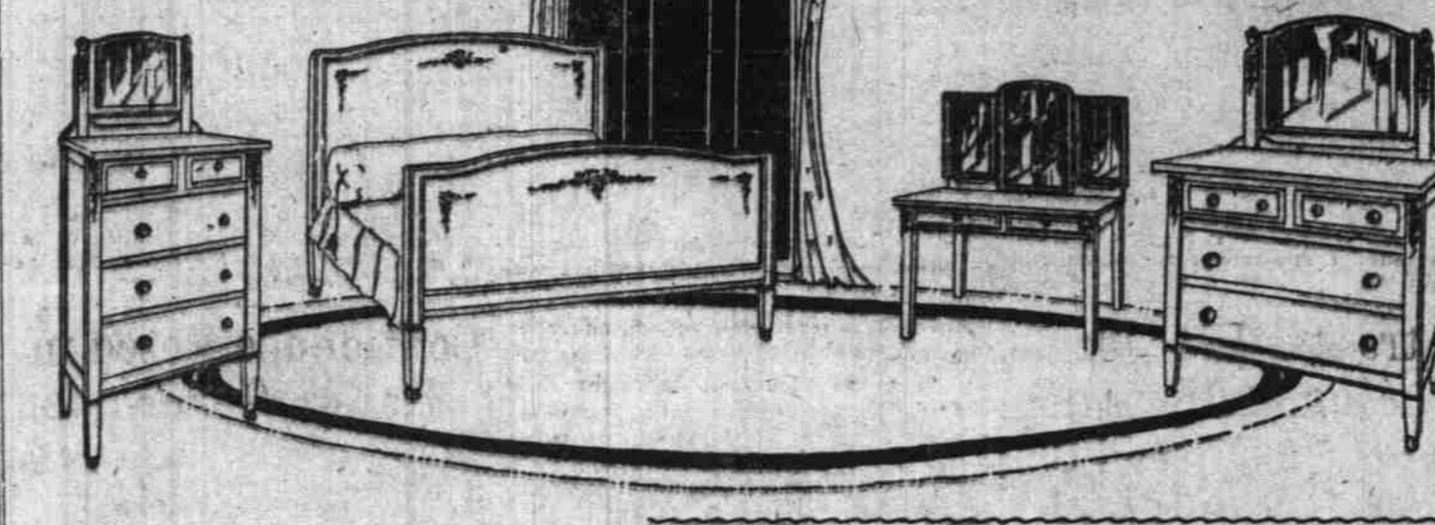
