

HISTORIAN HART PREDICTS ANOTHER WAR IN FIVE YEARS

Predicting another European war within the next five years, in which Germany and Russia, and possibly Japan will be allied against the rest of the civilized world, Dr. Albert Bushnell Hart, professor of history of Harvard university, who is a Portland visitor, deplored the fate of the League of Nations and the nomination by both political parties of what he termed "weak" men.

"I am a reconstructive progressive," declared Dr. Hart, "but there is no place in the world for this today. I do not like either presidential candidate, for neither is a first class man. The presidency of the United States is a big office and a third class man cannot fill it. It won't be filled by either Cox or Harding, because neither has the leadership power to be an independent president. There will be other men who will be the controlling power, and whichever nominee is elected, the presidency will be conducted practically by a commission, and I don't believe that is a good thing. I believe in big men in big places. In both conventions the big men were killed off and small men chosen."

"Decisions will not be made by Cox or Harding, because neither has the sand to stand against powerful opposition in his party. In both parties, it is the organizations in the most highly organized states—that is, that have the most political—that make the nominations, carry on the campaigns and frame the platforms."

"We will have a president who is honest and straightforward, but who is not a man of power. This means that foreign relations are going to be governed by men who haven't the experience nor the ability to make decisions. Hence, the decisions will be made by other people."

"As to a third party, there is nothing behind it strong nor prominent. It is a group of disgruntled folk. Some are progressives and labor men, but there are not enough of them. The labor men might have power to establish a party, but I think it is unlikely because the labor men would not be of sufficient strength unless the farmers voted the labor ticket. Furthermore, these men have been either Democrats or Republicans, and active in national politics, and if they supported a farm and labor party they would have to break away from their former connections."

U. S. CANNOT KEEP OUT

"The present League of Nations is absolutely doomed. There is not a possibility of it ever being accepted by the people of the United States. Some sort of league of nations should be formed and it is unfortunate to have a weak president, because the next president must take the lead in some sort of organization of this kind."

"There will be another European war within the next five years. Germany and Russia are going together—possibly

Japan. That will be a strong combination, stronger by far than Germany and Austria. It looks to me as though they will make war any time they think it is safe. I don't think there is a fighting chance for the United States to stand off. I think we will get into it in the same manner as we were forced to enter the world war."

A banquet was given at the Portland hotel Tuesday evening by the Portland lodge of the Loyal Order of Moose officers and past dictators, in honor of Professor Hart and ex-Congressman J. J. Lents of Indiana. The Moose band serenaded during the banquet. Addresses were given at the Moose temple by both speakers.

SINGLE TAXERS BOLT AND PUT OUT OWN TICKET

Chicago, July 14.—(U. P.)—A new national ticket was in the field today, launched by the Single Tax party, which bolted the new "third party."

It comprised:

Robert C. Macauley, Philadelphia, for president.

R. C. Barnum, Cleveland, for vice president.

The entire platform, adopted in convention last night, is:

Full rental value of the land shall be collected by the government instead of all taxes, and all building and other improvement on land, all industry, thrift and enterprise, all wages, salaries, incomes and every profit on labor shall be entirely exempt from taxation.

"The fusion of the Forty-eighters with the Laborites was nothing but a betrayal of the Single Tax party and the Forty-eighters' own delegates to the board of soviet in Carmen's hall," Macauley declared in his acceptance speech.

Russians Pressing Westward

London, July 14.—(U. P.)—The Russian army that occupied Minsk is pushing westward and has taken two more towns, according to a soviet communiqué wireless from Moscow today.

TURKISH LEADER FLINGS OLD DEF AT GREEK ARMY

Constantinople, July 14.—(U. P.)—A medieval challenge to battle has been sent by Mustapha Kemal Pasha, leader of the Turkish nationalists, to the commander of the Greek army that is advancing through Anatolia, according to a telegram from Smyrna today.

A modern touch was given to the challenge, however, when the nationalist sent it by airplane. He proposed that the Turkish and Greek armies engage in conflict in the region of Afium-Karahissar, 175 miles south of Constantinople, to determine the victor.

Mustapha Kemal Pasha is reported to have ordered the Turks at Erzerum to attack the Armenians.

Attack on Harding Is Called Base Lie

Washington, July 13.—(U. P.)—Branding as a "contemptible lie" a recent statement that Warren G. Harding once said "a dollar a day is enough for any working man," the Republican Publicity association issued a statement from its headquarters here likening the alleged attack on the Republican presidential nominee to the "run, Romanism and rebellion" campaign against James G. Blaine in 1884.

Petrograd Workmen's Disorders Continue

Washington, July 14.—(U. P.)—Economic disorders continue in Petrograd because of failure of important employers to grant further concessions to soviet workmen, the state department was advised today.

Ex-Champ Sues; He Didn't Steal Shoes

New York, July 14.—(U. P.)—"Batting" Nelson, former lightweight champion of the world, has brought suit in the federal district court, through his attorney, for \$225,000 against the Neumours Trading corporation. The "Durable Dams" was arrested several weeks ago, charged with stealing a pair of shoes in a sale conducted by the corporation here, and claims his reputation suffered as a result.

Lewis county, Washington, 36,740; increase since 1910, 4613, or 14.4 per cent.

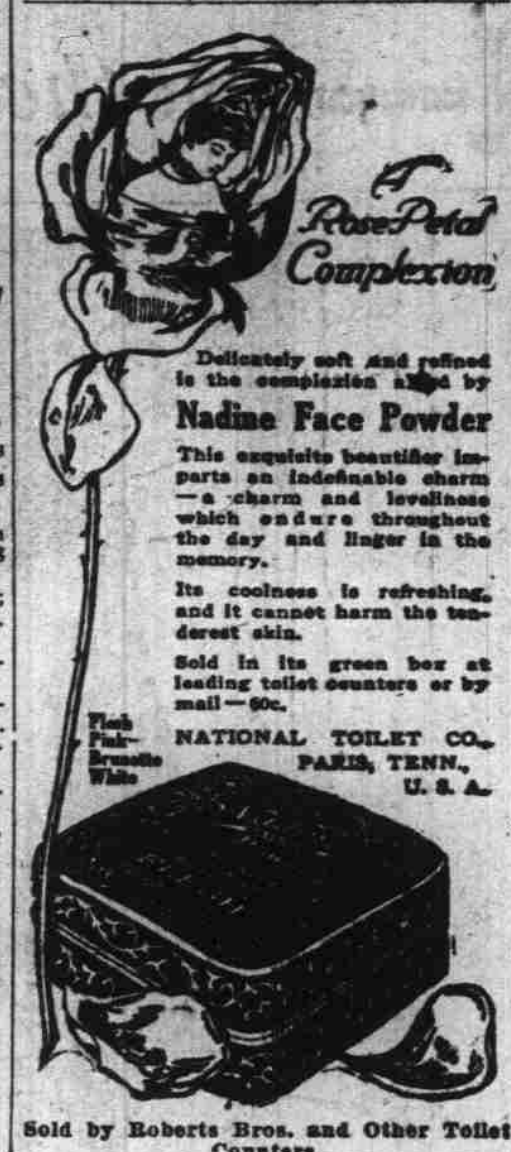
Mason county, Washington, 4919; decrease since 1910, 237, or 4.6 per cent.
