FASHIONS OF FALLAs Huge, Uncouth Brutes Waddle

fall fashions are breaking one of
the ten commandments. Fashion
seems to know not the meaning of
"no graven images." Oncoming
sartorial combinations announce that
they are "new" by being almost en-
croached with freakish figures in em-
brodery or paint.

There are most immodest Hottentots,
squirreling lizards, leering cannibals,
beasts and birds of every ilk, crawling
beetles and armored warriors. Flap
Dame Rumor has it that these fashion
offerings are intended to soothe the
savage breast of the mourners over the
departed picturesque panoramas that
were sent to whoever quaffed deeply
of the brimming bowl.

LIKE DELIRIUM TREMENS
However, a gazer at new coats,
blouses, dresses and suits all embel-
lished with weird figures cannot believe
that even delirium tremens ever pro-
duced such sights as these.

Blouses seem to revel in this new
freak more than any other branch of
the clothing realm. A leading specialty
house on the avenue shows an over-
blouse of navy georgette. Long fes-
toons of fringe drip from the sleeves
and collar, and a wreath of dark-
visaged and armored cannibals march
grimly about the hem of the blouse.
The very visible figures of the warriors
are rather swollen and because of their
presence they swell the "figures" on
the blouse, which sells for \$4.99.

BEASTS HUGE, UNCOUTH
Past geological epochs are portrayed
upon silk and satin by the designer.
Huge, uncouth beasts such as the dino-
saur, mammoth and reptile-bird waddle
around milady's coat collar or blouse.
The more expensive models have these
figures painted in gorgeous hues upon
the fabric, but startling effects are
given by the use of metallic threads,
colored wools and gaudy beads.

Egyptians, the alligator of the Gambia
and the white elephant of Siam are
favorite patterns. It seems to be that

He Reads Another
Man's Confession
Then Tells Himself

Chicago, July 17.—The story told the
police by Charles E. Brierty, a train
employee of the Thomas J. Lipton com-
pany, of how he stole \$70,000 from his
company over a period of years and put
the totals in a little "hell book" that re-
mained to torment him, affected Axel
Hedberg, former lieutenant of the Swed-
ish royal guards, very deeply.
He read the story over and over, he
told the police. The pricking of con-
science, the sleepless nights described by
Brierty, were no strangers to him, he
said. He had stolen \$25,000 from the
Union bank of Chicago, he voluntarily
confessed. Hedberg has been known as
the "count" in the gay night resorts.
He was a \$125 a month teller.
"I spent hundreds of dollars every
night," he confessed, according to the
police. "After my wife died I didn't
care. The money went in the cabarets
and to women I met. I don't know their
names. You can always find them in
the cafes. When I read Brierty's story
it got me to thinking. I know all he
suffered. I did as he did. I went to
William Tholin, the assistant cashier,
and blurted out the truth."

Panama Canal Made
Nearly Two Millions
Clear in 12 Months

Balboa, Canal Zone, July 17.—Prelim-
inary figures issued today show that
during the fiscal year ending June 30
the Panama canal conducted the great-
est volume of traffic of any year since
it was completed.
During these 12 months, 2476 commercial
vessels of 6,045,000 net tonnage
passed through the canal. They carried
9,875,000 tons of cargo.
The revenue for this period will reach
approximately \$3,500,000, exceeding the
operating expenses by more than a mil-
lion and three quarters. This reduces
the deficit on canal operations from pre-
vious years to \$2,588,000.
