

FRUIT JARS STAY ON THE SHELVES

Fruit jars are a drag on the market at this time. Not more than 20 per cent of the usual canning by housewives has been done to date this season in Portland and the season is well advanced. It is too late to consider the canning of loganberries, raspberries or blackberries except at extreme prices, for the season is ending fast. Cultivated blackberries will soon be available and wild stock is now making its appearance.

Peaches will remain high all through the season from present indications, but apricots are expected to be fairly plentiful.

There is a good crop of apples in sight and apple butter must take the place of other fruits this season.

Prunes will show one of the greatest crops known in this section and prices are more moderate.

Pears have been arriving in small supply from California, but the price is far too high.
