

AWARD ACCEPTED FOR TIME BEING UNDER PROTEST

Chicago, July 23.—(I. N. S.)—The specter of a national railroad strike executed a quick fade-out today, at least for the time being.

Following meetings which lasted until late Thursday night, the representatives of 16 of the 17 transportation unions, acting separately, voted to accept under protest the \$300,000,000 wage increase award of the United States labor board.

The chiefs of nine of the unions voted to accept the award outright, without submitting it to a referendum vote of the rank and file of their organizations. The heads of seven other unions voted to place the award before their members for a referendum, recommending that it be accepted.

Only one of the unions—the Order of Railroad Telegraphers—voted to take the award to its membership at large with the order that a strike vote be taken.

REFERENDUM SEPT. 1
Final decision on the award by the vote of the railroad workers who are to record their attitude toward it by the referendum will not be made before September 1, it was stated by the brotherhood heads.

Here is the way the union leaders voted:
For acceptance under protest without a referendum—Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, Switchmen's union of North America, Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Engineers, Order of Railroad Conductors, United Brotherhood of Maintenance of Way Employees and Railroad Shop Laborers, Brotherhood of Stationary Firemen and Oilers, Masters, Mates and Pilots of America, Brotherhood of Railway and Steamship Clerks, Freight Handlers, Express and Station Employees.

For submission to referendum, with acceptance recommended—Railway Employees' department of the American Federation of Labor, International Association of Machinists, Sheet Metal Workers' International alliance, Brotherhood of Railway Carmen of America; International Brotherhood of Blacksmiths, Drop Forgers and Helpers; International Brotherhood of Boiler-makers, Iron Ship-builders and Helpers of America; Brotherhood of Railway Signalmen of North America.

For rejection, with the ordering of a strike vote—Order of Railroad Telegraphers.

However disappointing the labor board's award may be to the various organizations affected, it is felt that the public interest demands its acceptance," commented L. E. Shepard, president of the Order of Railroad Conductors.

The stand of the Railroad Telegraphers was put forward by E. J. Manion, president of the organization, in a statement declaring they had been "discriminated against in the award."

Heads of the "outlaw" unions in a separate meeting voted 11 to 1 to accept the award, although they were not included in its provisions. It was reported at the federal building today that grand jury action may be taken here Monday against the "rebel" chiefs under the Lever act unless the striking switchmen who have not yet returned to work are back on jobs by that time. The strikers claim they are "merely on a vacation."

Boy Riding as Hobo Beaten and Thrown Off After Robbery

Severely beaten with rocks in the hands of two unidentified companions, Cecil Coons, aged 19, is at St. Vincent's hospital in a dazed condition, and \$66 he carried while riding "hobo" style on an inbound O-W., R. & N. Co. train is missing.

The lad was beating his way into Portland from the East and in the gambler car were the companions who discovered his possession of money. At Rooster rock the train took a siding late Thursday night and during the halt the men attacked Coons.

When they had robbed him, Coons was

thrown from the train and left in the grass, where he was found by deputies from Sheriff Hubbard's office with injuries that probably will not prove serious.

Remains of French, Lost in Mountains, Brought to City

Remains of Henry A. French of Portland, who was lost in the mountains east of Bellingham in June, 1918, were brought to Portland Thursday by Lloyd A. French, his son, and were taken in charge by the Finley Undertaking company. Funeral arrangements will be announced later.

The elder French had been employed by the P. R. L. & P. company, prior to going to Monte Cristo early in 1918 for his health. He left the hotel at that place on the morning of July 16, 1918, but never returned. Searching parties and blood hounds failed to find him. Last Monday a young man, while hunting in the mountains, found a skull and human bones and the remains were identified as those of the missing man by articles belonging to French.

Ordered to Deliver Oil to U. S. Navy at Government Price

San Francisco, July 23.—(U. P.)—Notice was served on local oil companies early today that they must deliver immediately to the Mare Island navy yard fuel necessary for the yard and ships stationed there, at the government's price of \$1.75 per barrel or it will be seized. The oil companies are holding out for \$2 per barrel.

When a similar situation arose recently in San Pedro, Cal., the federal court refused to grant the General Petroleum company an injunction forbidding the government to seize the oil.

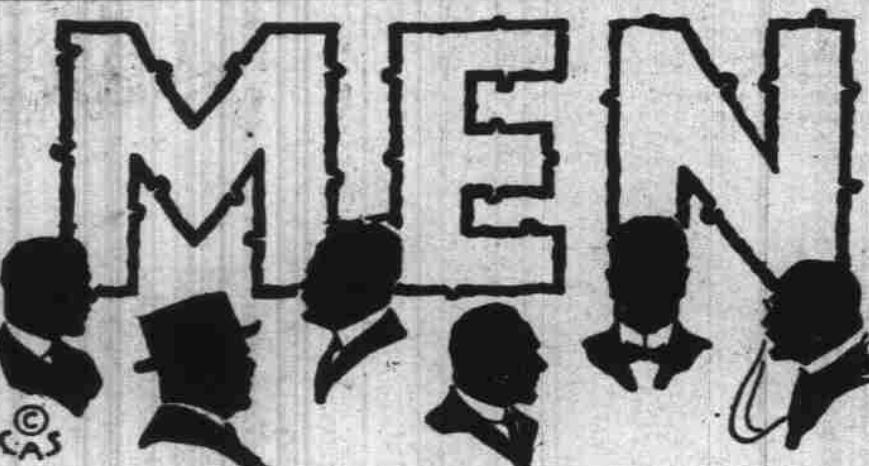

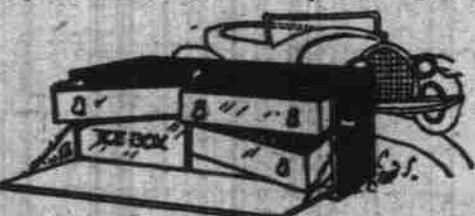
