

SALT LAKE CITY'S YOUNGEST MAYOR PROVES DEFAULTER

Bock Steals \$10,000 to Handle Mining Deal and Support His Family While With Red Cross.

Salt Lake, July 24.—Edmund A. Bock, who Thursday resigned as mayor of Salt Lake after confessing that as city auditor, a position he formerly held, he had embezzled in excess of \$10,000, gave himself up for arrest Friday. C. Clarence Neslen, commissioner of water works, will in all probability be chosen to fill the unexpired term of Mayor Bock.

The startling discovery of Bock's embezzlement of more than \$10,000 from the city funds, while serving as city auditor, his subsequent confession of guilt and the acceptance of his resignation formed the closing chapters in the public and political life of one of the nation's youngest metropolitan mayors. Bock is 30 years old.

PAYS BACK \$10,000 SHORTAGE
Discovery of the shortage was made in a special audit of the city's books. Bock turned over a check to City Attorney Pollard for the full amount of his shortage and tendered his resignation. He then told how the abstractions had been made and expressed a willingness to face the consequences.

The former mayor confessed to having taken the money from public funds to protect his mining stocks and insure support of his family while he served overseas as a Red Cross worker during the war.

Bock admitted his first adventure into crooked paths occurred when he found himself involved in a mining deal that required more money than he could honestly command, or else the abandonment and sacrifice of the provision he had built up for his family.

"When I went overseas I did not know whether I would ever return," said Bock. "I wanted to be sure my family was well provided for. When I returned I found the shortage had not been discovered. Then I began planning a way to return the money. The only way I could do this would be to take someone into my confidence. I had the money to make up the shortage, and kept it intact. But there seemed no way to put it back. I was afraid to trust anyone and drag them into the scheme of righting a wrong that was only my own. Now, that it is over, I feel better."

Examination Rules Changed to Defeat Japanese Intrigue

Sacramento, July 24.—Intrigue practiced by Japanese seeking certificates to practice medicine has resulted in the abolishment of foreign language medical examinations by the state board of medical examiners, according to the announcement today by C. B. Pinkham, secretary of the board.

Pinkham announced that the board had learned through an investigation that C. Nacayama, Japanese interpreter, had made it possible for all oriental applicants to pass the medical examinations by assisting them in their work and correcting all mistakes while translating the papers. Nacayama was appointed upon the recommendation of the Japanese consulate of Los Angeles, who vouched for his integrity.

Nacayama confessed his guilt to the medical board following the disclosure, and said he had carried on correspondence with prospective applicants among his countrymen and had for a certain recompense secured their licenses from the board.

Miss Stimson Made Head of Army Nurse Corps and Is Major

Washington, July 17.—Miss Julia L. Stimson of New York city today was named by Secretary of War Baker as superintendent of the army nurse corps with the rank of major.

Miss Stimson served with the army in France, receiving the distinguished service medal and the British B. R. C. She went to France in May, 1917, as chief nurse of the St. Louis Red Cross unit. In April, 1918, she was made chief nurse of the American Red Cross in France and in November, 1918, was named director of the army nurse corps in France. Since returning to the United States, Miss Stimson has been assistant superintendent and acting superintendent of the corps.

Army and Navy Club Like Memorial Plan

New York, July 24.—(I. N. S.)—A group of men interested in the proposed officers' memorial hall and clubhouse, to be erected in this city by the Army and Navy club of America, were the guests of Colonel John W. Prentiss in the recess club. The plan is to memorialize each officer who died in the service and to preserve all war records in a building which probably will cost \$2,000,000 to construct. Rear-Admiral Bradley A. Fiske, U. S. N., retired, agreed to serve as president. Others who accepted life membership were General William J. Nicholson, Major General Samuel McRoberts, Colonel Francis L. Robbins Jr., and Colonel David M. Goodrich.

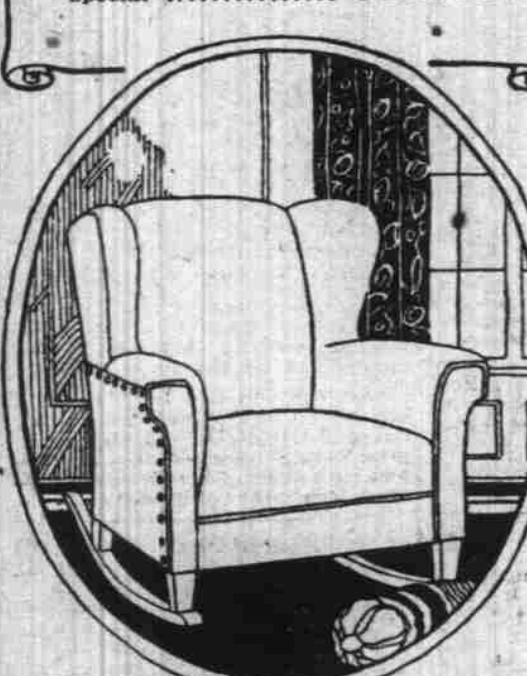
To tear up asphalt paving between street car rails a California man has invented a sort of scoop that can be mounted in front of a car, into which they asphalt is almost automatically loaded.
