

### FAMILY OF FOUR MAY EARN \$30 A DAY IN FLAX FIELD

Two weeks of pleasant work in the state flax fields, where it is possible for a family of four to earn more than \$30 daily, is offered to 150 persons in Portland or elsewhere, who are at liberty to start work Saturday morning.

Although the state had contemplated pulling its flax crop by machine, it is said that the private flax acreage this year is so great that all pulling machines are privately occupied, and hand pulling is necessary to save the state crop.

The public employment bureau, upstairs at 211 Pine street, Thursday received requests for 150 helpers from Charles Gram, state labor commissioner, and must recruit the company of pullers by 1:45 p. m. Friday, when the group will leave for the fields at Aumsville and Turner aboard a Southern Pacific train. Free wood and water will be furnished all help, but pullers are asked to take their own tents and camp equipment. Entire families will be welcomed.

A family of four persons, it is said, can pull an acre of flax daily, and the state is paying from \$25 to \$30 an acre for pulling, depending upon the stand. Applicants, individually or in groups,
