

LAST CALL FOR BERRIES IS GIVEN

The season for berries is about over so far as the raspberries, blackberries and loganberries are concerned and housewives must hurry to get their actual requirements for prices are again advancing.

Blackberries are arriving in fair supply, but the season for this fruit will likely be at its full within the next 10 days. At this time blackberries are too high for canning.

Within the next few days will be the

best time to go into the woods and gather wild blackberries. The crop this season is a good one.

Peaches are arriving in carload lots from California and it is now believed that the prices are either at the bottom for the present season or within a fraction of it. Elberts and Crawford are both arriving.

Peach plums are coming from the Dalles and are selling around 25 and 22.5¢ per crate of four baskets in the retail shops.

Cherries are in small supply but the quality is again favorable with prices unchanged.

Apricots are in good supply with prices about at the bottom so far as good quality is concerned.

The following prices are average ones the consumers are expected to pay retail prices. Quality noted is average, fancy stuff being slightly higher and inferior stuff fractionally lower.

Butter—Best creamery prints, 65¢ @ 64¢.

Eggs—Fresh, laid, 55¢ @ 57¢ per dozen; fancy, 50¢ @ 52¢ per dozen.

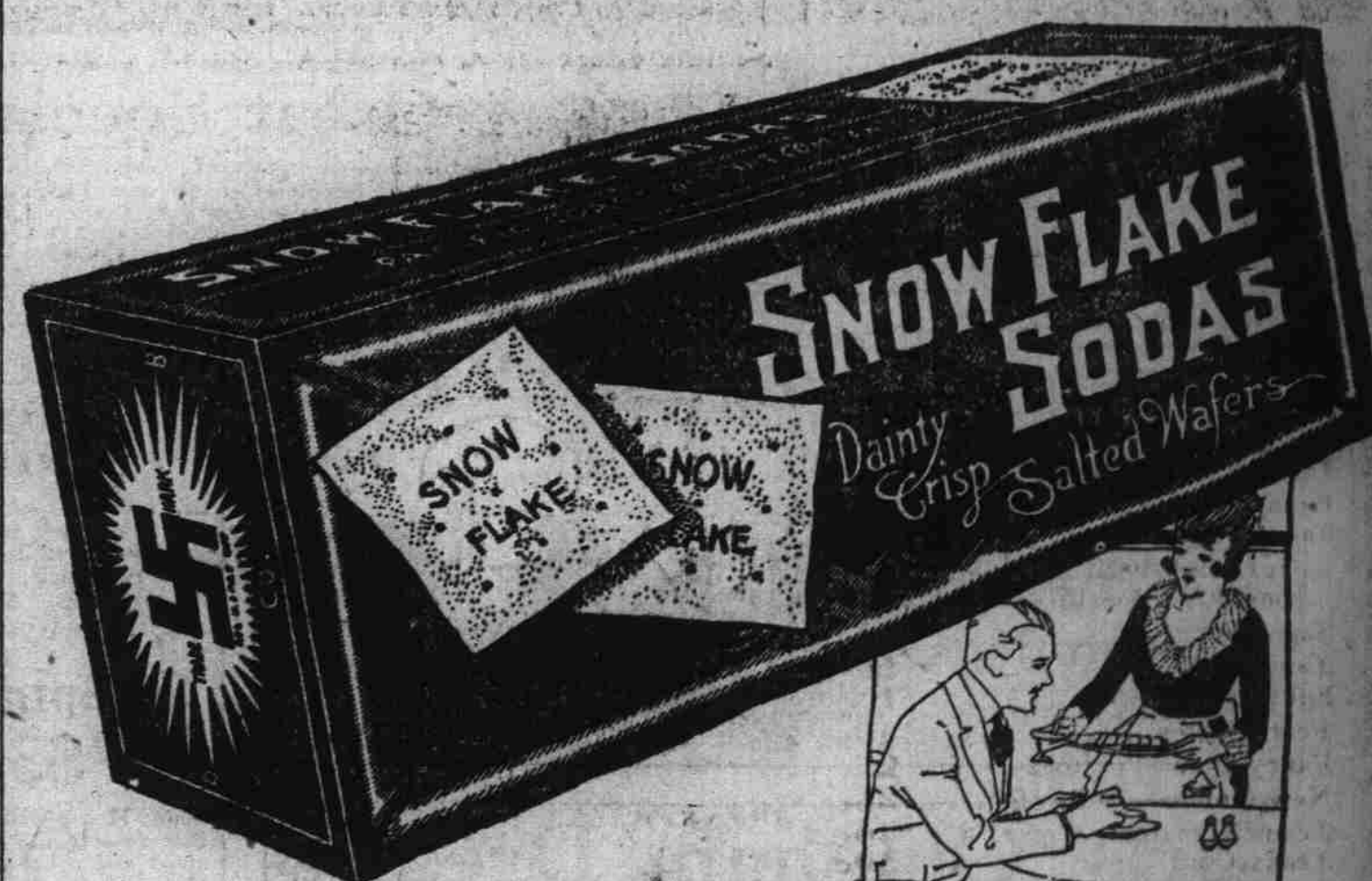
