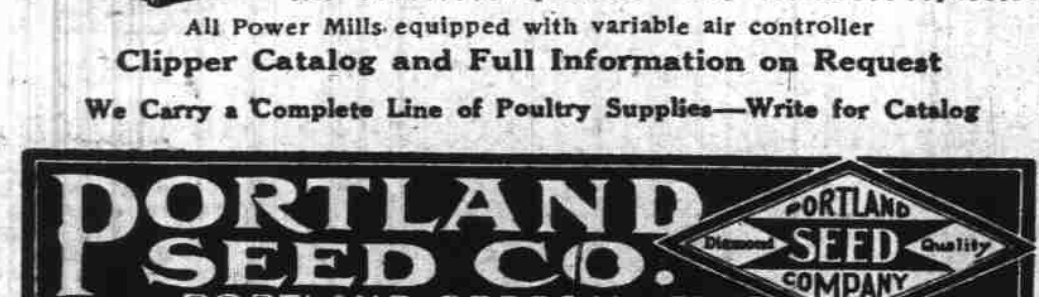

JOURNALS RUSHED TO GROCERYMEN'S PICNIC IN PLANE

Harding Flies to Bonneville in 30 Minutes and Lands Safely in Spite of Bumpy Air.

Just half an hour's flying was required by Captain F. E. Harding to carry the Journals from Lewis and Clark field to Bonneville for the grocers' picnic Wednesday afternoon.

It was the first time that a seaplane landing had been attempted in swift waters of the Columbia as it plunges through the gorge just below Cascade Locks, but Harding successfully accomplished the feat, not only in the current which was kicking up little white caps, but in the face of a heavy wind.

Conditions were regarded as too dangerous, however, to carry passengers, and so, after a short exhibition flight over the picnic grounds, the flier returned to Portland.

Captain F. E. Harding is the senior pilot of the Oregon, Washington & Idaho Airplane company's organization. He has made many successful trips to Bonneville in the Journal's seaplane express service. His total number of flying hours is over 5000.

Accompanying Captain Harding on the flight to Bonneville was A. L. Holtgrede of the sales organization of the Tru-Blu Biscuit company. The latter concern had planned to advertise its product by dropping little gateboard airplanes over the field, two of which were to have given the fliers free trips, but the air was a little too bumpy for the passengers' flights to be attempted.

SALEM LODGE OF ELKS REPLIES TO PULPIT CHARGES

Acts of Divers Persons Deplored During Convention, But Body Denies Inspired Them.

Salem, Or., July 31.—Replying to charges and allegations contained in resolutions passed by the Salem Ministerial association and the various churches of the city earlier in the week, condemning the use of intoxicants in Salem during the convention of the Oregon State Elks association here last week, resolutions adopted by a special committee of the local lodge today declare that "Salem Lodge No. 336, B. P. O. E., has no apology to make for any act or deed committed by or authorized to be done by the lodge, its members or the state association."

The resolution admits that "certain just criticism has been made in the public press condemning the acts of divers persons, who, during the said state convention, committed disgraceful and unlawful acts in public places in the city of Salem," and declares "the fact that certain rough and unscrupulous persons took advantage of the occasion to carry out their unlawful schemes to the detriment of the peace and dignity of our fair city."

On the other hand the resolution points to the fact that "Salem Lodge No. 336 has a membership of nearly 1000 composed of the best citizens of Marion and Polk counties, whose patriotism and christian integrity is of the highest type" and cheerfully submits the persons of the local order for comparison with any organization of like character as to its American citizenship, patriotism and law abiding qualities.

Canneries Offering \$1 Each for Salmon; Highest Price Paid

Bellingham, Wash., July 31.—(I. N. S.)—Although canneries are offering \$1 each for salmon, the plants are idle or operating at small capacity. Only six canneries of the large number here and on the San Juan Islands are trying to operate.

The price for sockeyes is the highest ever paid in the history of the now threadbare industry. Contrasted with the figure of 15 cents a few years ago, fishermen apparently are making fortunes. But where millions of fish existed a short time ago only a few score are taken now.

Albany Chamber to Establish Bureau to Supply Farm Help

Albany, July 31.—Albany's Chamber of Commerce has undertaken to establish a free employment bureau where farmers who want labor can find help. Applications from 13 working men are on file.
