

COX IS READY FOR BIG FIGHT, HE TELLS PICNICKERS

Dayton, Ohio, Aug. 5.—"Boys, I am ready for the fight."
This was the challenge Governor James M. Cox sent in the direction of the Republican stronghold at Marion, as he spoke Wednesday from the boxing ring at a picnic of the local City Democratic club.
Although steering clear of political issues in the main, because of his speech of acceptance, Cox caused the picnic grounds to reverberate with cheers as he gave vigorous assurances that he is prepared for the big battle and is out to win. It was what may be considered the first big stump speech of his campaign.
The scene of the picnic was in a grove along a small creek, with cornfields all around.
COX ENTERS RING
As he stepped into the ring where several bouts had been held a short time before, Cox said:
"Where's my corner?"
"Bring on Harding," someone in the crowd shouted. "No, no," cried another Democrat. "He wouldn't last one round."
"Boys, I can't talk today because of my speech of acceptance Saturday," Cox began.
"Cut loose, Jimmy; go after 'em," someone shouted.
"I am proud of the fight you made for me at San Francisco," Cox continued, "and, boys, I am ready for the fight."
"We have won before with the same kind of a fight. We will win again, because right will triumph and we deserve to win."
The opposition is doing what we farmers used to do—plowing around the stumps—seeking to avoid things that perplex. Our course is the straight course. We need make no defense. Ours will be an offensive fight from the beginning to the end. And it will be considered a fight.
"Something tells me we are going to win as certain as the sun sets in the west, and I will carry the campaign north, east, south and west, recognizing only the limitations of time. I will expect your congratulations in November, and on March 4 I will reserve a place of honor in the inaugural parade down Pennsylvania avenue for you Dayton Democrats."
RAPS HARDING POLICY
Cox touched on Harding's theory of party government, when he declared that the executive must, after taking counsel with others, be "responsible to his own conscience, and not a group of party leaders."
The picnic was the largest in the history of the club. Clarence Greer, in charge of the affair, said, as soon as the governor appeared, a swarm of Democrats flocked about his car and most of them he called by their first names. While most of the picnickers were seated on the ground for a picture, a chair in the center of the semicircle was offered Cox.
"Why, boys, you don't think I am too old to sit on the ground with the rest of you?" he asked as he pushed the chair aside.
