

DETECTIVES GUARD MANNIX LEST HE ESCAPE TO IRELAND

Dublin Aug. 12.—"My son is a man of peace, he wouldn't hurt a fly," was the comment of Mrs. Mannix, 89 years old, the mother of Archbishop Daniel J. Mannix of Melbourne, Australia, now in England under surveillance. "I hope God will spare him and induce the English officials to let him come home to me. I am too old to make the trip to England to see him."

London, Aug. 12.—(U. P.)—A cordon of detectives stood guard today around the Nazareth house, in the suburbs, where Archbishop Daniel Mannix is resting after his trip from America to England. The purpose of the detectives was to keep the prelate from slipping out of the house and going secretly to Ireland. The government has forbidden him to visit Ireland.

It would take the pen of Conan Doyle, creator of Sherlock Holmes, to do justice to the scenes that were witnessed during the night, as the Scotland Yard sleuths patrolled their beats, on the alert for clues that might indicate the Australian-Irish prelate was plotting to escape.

Every vehicle emerging from the yard of Nazareth house was pounced upon by the detectives, who searched it carefully as if expecting to discover Mannix concealed in it. All persons coming out of the house were halted, scrutinized and interrogated, the Scotland Yard agents evidently suspecting the archbishop might attempt to walk boldly away, his identity cloaked behind some baffling disguise. Meanwhile the friends of Mannix ridiculed the police.

The prelate told the United Press he had not yet decided on what he would do and that he would first seek legal advice. He said he planned to spend today resting.

"These Scotland Yard men are ridiculous and silly," declared Father Vaughn, secretary to Mannix, as he looked from a window and saw a cluster of detectives milling around in front of the house. "It was reported that the Sinn Féin intelligence department submitted a half dozen plans by means of any one of which Mannix might be able to escape from Nazareth house."

Governor Olcott Does Not Want to Embarrass Harding

Salem, Aug. 12.—Although Governor Olcott is in favor of a man from one of the reclamation states of the west for the position of secretary of the interior, he does not believe in embarrassing a presidential candidate by asking for a pledge to such an appointment prior to his election to office. He so expresses himself in reply to a letter from Governor Hart of Washington, soliciting the Oregon executive's cooperation in pleading Senator Harding, whose election as president he anticipates, to the selection of a western man for this post. Declaring that he believes such a course to be "unwise, unjust and an imposition upon Senator Harding," Governor Olcott expresses his disapproval of the move.

McKinnon Declares Downs Took \$500

Police are searching for John Downs, until recently employed as an orderly at St. Vincent's hospital, on complaint of Donald McKinnon, who said Downs has \$500 belonging to him. McKinnon said he met Downs at Seaside and asked him to take care of his money, the caretaker later ignoring an appointment to return it.

Roosevelt Appeals For Repudiation of Old Guard G. O. P.

Chicago, Aug. 12.—Appealing particularly to the "progressive thought" of the Republican party, Franklin D. Roosevelt, vice presidential candidate on the Democratic ticket, in a vigorous address before 4000 persons Wednesday night at the Auditorium, urged a repudiation in November of Senator Harding and his sponsors of "the old guard."

Roosevelt addressed himself "particularly to those in this hall who are not Democrats."

He declared that Senator Harding and "the old guard" have disregarded the progressive warning of 1911, and "with their eyes on the ground they are marking time and offering the country no real remedies or constructive program to meet the national and international problems of the day."

Washington, Aug. 12.—(I. N. S.)—Secretary of the Navy Daniels announced Wednesday afternoon that the navy department had arranged contracts for 90 per cent of its fuel requirements for the Pacific fleet and for its entire gasoline supply for the fleet for a period of three months. The contracts fix a basic price over the three months' period of \$2 a barrel for fuel oil and 2 1/2 cents a gallon for gasoline.

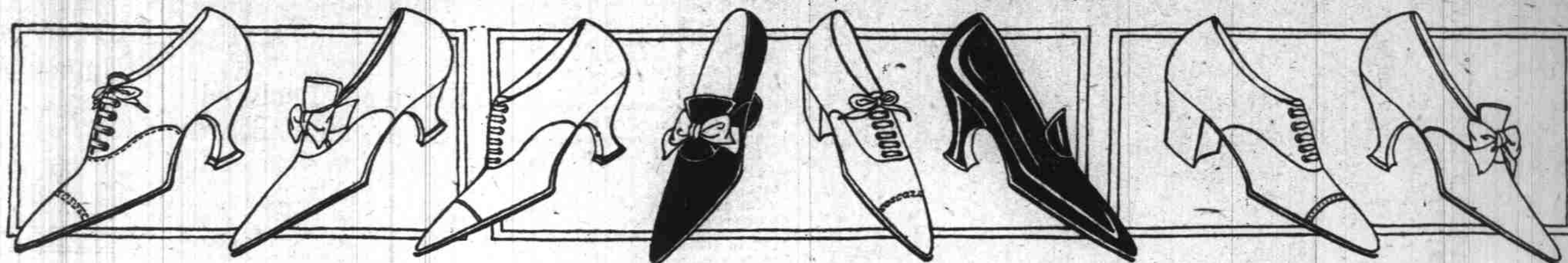

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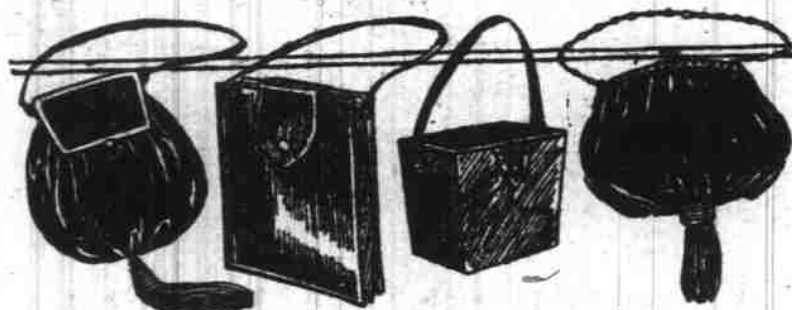
