

ENGLAND ENTERS EASTERN MARKET FOR BREADSTUFF SUPPLY

A carload of eggs is being shipped to the East by a local firm Friday, but outside business is not good because of the hot weather which interferes with the quality of supplies.

Weather conditions are such today that it would be advisable for country meat shippers to retain their stock at home rather than send dressed supplies to the market.

While receipts of calves have not been liberal along the coast, the extreme hot weather, together with the low price of hides, has resulted in a demoralized market.

Butter Trade Holding Steady

Market for butter is showing a steady tone here with the advanced price of butter maintained. Cakes are likewise fractionally better although little of the extra grade is available.

Wholesale Peaches are Received

Shipments of Rogue River peaches came to the market Friday and sold around \$1.75 a box for Clatsop County and \$1.50 for best Elbertas and Muirs.

Tomato Market Again Lowered

Tomato market is again lowering with Columbia river fancy stock offering around 75¢ to 85¢ generally. Some crates of four barrel crates, 2 1/2 bushels, were on consignment.

High Prices Cows are Seeking

The Wenatchee agents which arrived Thursday week in each lot consisted of four barrel crates. Despite the high price of \$2.25 for 15 pounds net they are selling well. Quality is fair.

Potato Trade is Marking Time

Trade in the potato market is marking time with demand limited and arrivals in excess of requirements. The hot weather interfering with sales as much of the stock is not well matured for keeping.

Chicago, Aug. 13. (I. N. S.) - Dressed markets at sharply lower levels marked Friday, the 10th, on the Board of Trade. Opening prices were unsettled, wheat starting sharply lower on expectations of a continuance of the export demand, making below yesterday's close. It was stated that the British commission agent had stepped out of the market and was buying at a price 1/2 cent below the market today's lowest, corn rallying most.

Corn opened easier on good rains which needed over the belt and amount around 2 cents more on selling by local professional bears.

What trade there was, a little restricted selling being sufficient to force the decline. Cash houses and elevator interests were the best buyers.

Grain opened higher and sharper advance in live hogs and what looked like more eastern orders for live hogs.

Trade in corn was light with commission houses and elevator interests were the best buyers.

Provisions opened higher with limited offerings and bids buying, encouraged by advances in hogs.
