

SOVIET INCREASING PRESSURE AGAINST GENERAL WRANGLER

Constantinople, Aug. 19.—(I. N. S.)—Via London, Aug. 20.—The Russian soviet army on the South Russian (Crimean) front has increased its pressure against the army of General Wrangel and was reported today to be advancing along the entire front.

The Reds have reached ground only 10 miles west of the Alexandrovsk Depiarsk railroad, north of the Sea of Azov.

Violent fighting is in progress between the Bolsheviks and General Wrangel's "White" forces, southwest of Orlovsk, in the vicinity of Kahova. The Reds have been reinforced.

Still and Owner on Scow at Linnton Are Taken Into Custody

Aboard a scow boat tied to the banks of the Willamette river three miles west of Linnton, revenue officers, aided by Sergeant Epps and Patrolman Huntington of the police department, early Friday morning confiscated a complete, elaborately finished still and arrested Carl Henry.

A delivery was in progress, revenue officers believe, when they approached, for two auto trucks were backed up to the scow. Henry had on the scow 10 gallons of figgled raisin whiskey and 50 gallons of mash, which, together with the still, were confiscated. Henry was lodged in the city jail.

British Soldiers re Rushed to Bagdad To Check Revolts

London, Aug. 20.—(I. N. S.)—Revolution has broken out in Mesopotamia and British reinforcements are being rushed from India to quell the disturbance, the war office announced today.

"Northeast and west of Bagdad the outbreaks are on a considerable scale," said the war office.

"The railway line between Bagdad and Kirtir Kirtut has been cut and the bridges burned. The British garrison at Kirtir Kirtut has been surrounded. Anarchy prevails in some districts."

Mrs. Charles Fisher Dies at Akron, Ohio

A telegram was received Thursday afternoon by A. F. Fiegl, 501 Jarrett street, announcing the death of Mrs. Charles F. Fisher at Akron, Ohio. Fisher is secretary of the city planning commission of the engineer's department at the city hall. He secured a year's leave of absence several months ago and went to Akron, accompanied by Mrs. Fisher, his wife, to take up similar work. Mrs. Fisher had lived in Portland many years and was widely known in woman's club and social circles. Her death occurred Thursday, according to the telegram, but no announcement was made of funeral arrangements.
