

### MAZAMAS BREAST TERRIFIC GALE ON MT. ADAMS' PEAK

A terrific, biting gale that made clinging to the icy summit of Mount Adams a difficult feat, met the 10 Portland Mazamas who Monday climbed the peak, according to word brought back by Eugene H. Dowling, leader of the party.

From the summit, the smoke from scores of forest fires lay like a blanket over the lowlands, with rising columns of belching smoke bursting through in places. The Lewis river fire between Adams and St. Helens looked especially spectacular from Adams' summit.

The climbers left Underwood for Morrison Creek Monday morning and from the latter place started at 4 p. m. Sunday for Cold Springs. Here they camped and started for the summit at 2:45 a. m. Monday. They reached the summit without mishap, Dowling urging that the members stick closely together. About two hours were spent on the summit, during which time the men helped carry part of the forest service lookout supplies over the mountain top. On the descent the sliding was excellent except for a few places and the party reached Morrison ranger station in fine spirits just a little before dark.

D. Vincent Stroup of the forest service, who was in the party and who climbs with the ease of a mountain goat, had made the climb by himself and, returning, met the others at Cold Springs. Immediately the party started and climbed the mountain the second time in two days.

Those who made the climb were: Mr. and Mrs. Eugene H. Dowling, D. C. Lewis, Fred McNeil of the Journal staff, Beatrice DeLacey, D. Vincent Stroup, Eric LaMada, Herbert Corning, Clyde Carlson, all of Portland, and Senora Fogelstrade of Vancouver.

### Strange Animal Is Identified as Pure Mountain Beaver

E. Kanouse, who has a ranch on the Clackamas river near Carver, caught a strange animal Wednesday. Never before had he seen its like. He brought it to Portland for scientific authorities on wild animals to identify. All day long he carried his animal over town but nobody knew what it was. The fish and game commission heard of it and its members said it must be a cross between a mole and a sonner.

At 5 p. m. Kanouse and his animal arrived at the United States biological survey office.

A bright and shining specimen of a pure mountain beaver, according to Stanley S. Jewett, assistant biologist, the moment his eyes fell upon the animal.

It is the second specimen of black mountain beaver that Jewett has ever seen.

Kanouse is having the specimen preserved.

### Warnings Against Non-partisans Are Given at Meeting

Salem, Aug. 20.—Warnings of the rapid encroachment of the Non-partisan league upon Oregon territory were sounded by speakers at a meeting in the Commercial club rooms here Wednesday afternoon. The league, it was said, is now active in 19 counties of this state, many of the agents of the organization going about over the field under the guise of salesmen and solicitors.

Plans were also made at the meeting to combat the inflated measure fixing the interest rate in Oregon at 4 and 5 per cent. Present at the meeting were Robert E. Smith of Portland, Lloyd Riches, secretary of the Oregon Editorial association; F. J. Gollehr of Portland, Joseph Mioello and Harry Fargeter of Roseburg.

### Additional Houses For Reed Faculty To Be Considered

The housing problem for members of the faculty of Reed college is being solved by the erection of four residences on Woodstock avenue between East Thirty-fourth and East Thirty-eighth streets. Permits granted the college Wednesday call for the erection of two houses costing \$12,500 each and two costing \$7,000 each. With the growth of attendance at the college the management has been at a loss to find housing facilities for additional members of the faculty. A. E. Doyle is architect for the new residences and Tellen Allyn is named as builder.

Building permits were also issued Wednesday to John Eddle for a residence costing \$3,000 at 251 California street between Second and Third, and to Charles Groner for a residence costing \$1,800 to be erected at 427 Bryant street.

### Permits to Install 33 Furnaces Given

Preparation for winter is reflected in 33 permits for the installation of furnaces issued at the city hall Wednesday. Prospects for a limited supply of fuel oil during the winter months make it necessary to alter many of the heating plants now in use for the accommodation of other fuel. Several furnaces designed to the Oregon climate are manufactured in Portland, and these are finding favor with home-builders. The aggregate cost of the furnace permits issued Wednesday is approximately \$10,000.

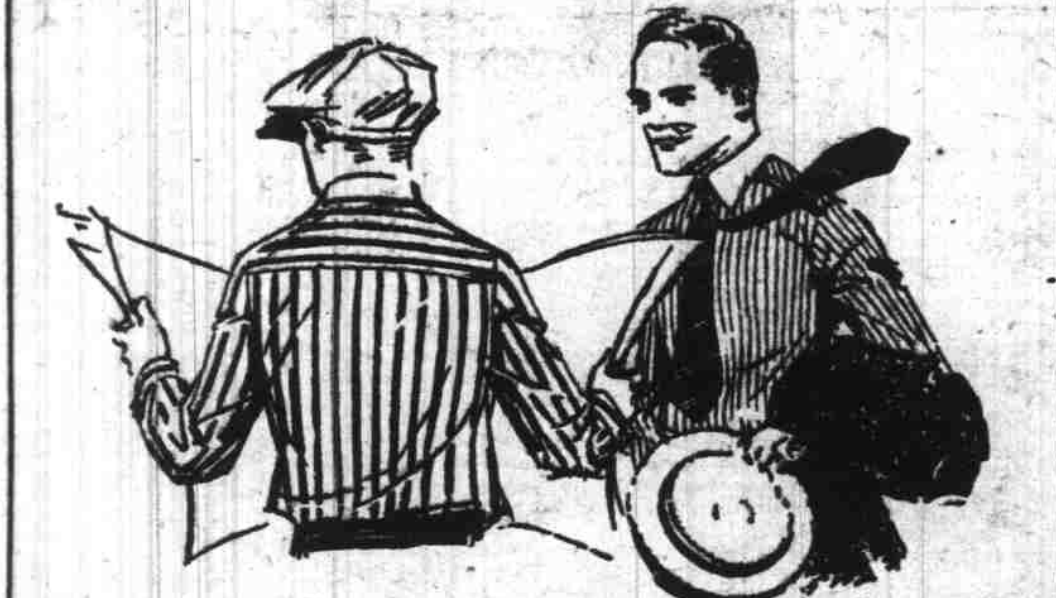
