

### HARDING WHIPPING LEAGUE RINGER IN FORM FOR STUMP

Marion, Ohio, Aug. 22.—(U. P.)—Hard at work on one of the biggest speeches of his campaign—the League of Nations address to be delivered here Saturday to the Indiana delegation, Senator Warren G. Harding saw few visitors today. This promises to be the biggest week of Harding's campaign thus far. Tomorrow a delegation of theatrical stars will call on him. Wednesday he addresses railroad men at Gallon, near here.

**SPEECH IS CRUCIAL**  
The Republican nominee considers his Saturday speech as one of the high lights of his campaign and is carefully guarding its contents. Colonel George Harvey, editor and bitter foe of the league, is assisting Harding on the document.

Senator Knox of Pennsylvania, who has made a careful legal study of the league covenant, and author of the peace resolution passed at the last senate, has been asked to come out and confer with Harding on this subject, but it is not known whether his health will permit him to make the trip from his home at Valley Forge.

**COX CHARGE "RIDICULOUS"**  
One report today was that the Saturday speech will contain the mysterious 12-word campaign slogan which is

said to have been written by Harding himself. Senator Harding today dismissed Governor Cox's charge that the Republicans are raising a \$15,000,000 campaign fund as "ridiculous."

"There is no foundation for it all," Harding said. "Let him make his revelations."

### Rammed Ore Ship Vanishes; No Trace Of Crew Is Found

Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., Aug. 22.—(L. N. S.)—Scores of vessels have passed the spot in Whitefish bay where the great steel ore carrier, Superior City, was rammed and sunk by the freighter Willis L. King Friday night, but no trace has been found today of any of the 29 persons believed to have perished when the ship went down. Not even a bit of floating wreckage has been sighted.

Coast guard officers along the shores have seen nothing and there is a growing belief that hope of any survivors being found is unwarranted. It is believed that the explosion which followed the collision and tore off the bow of the Superior City flooded the ship and drowned members of the crew in their berths.

### Mexico Intercedes For Kidnaped Yanks

Washington, Aug. 22.—The Mexican government has notified the American embassy at Mexico City that "urgent steps" have been taken to secure the release of several American citizens and other foreigners kidnaped by the bandit leader Zamora, the state department announced today.

### GASOLINE SUPPLY GAINING RAPIDLY

Washington, Aug. 22.—(L. N. S.)—The oil supply in the United States is more favorable than it has been for months, according to government experts.

Dr. David White of the bureau of mines cites the following developments which have improved so materially the outlook for oil:

Oil production in the United States jumped sharply in June, the output being 37,219,000 barrels, with a daily average production of 1,240,633 barrels, the greatest ever recorded for one month.

**MEXICAN SUPPLY GAINING**  
In addition imports from Mexico jumped and Dr. White estimated these would double in a year. The present total output figure is roughly 50,000,000 barrels.

The consumption of oil has remained stationary for months and in June it actually began to decline.

With regard to California, Dr. White predicts that at the present rate, California within two years will be dependent entirely on mid continent sources and Mexico for her oil and gasoline. He pointed out that the recent jump in production in the mid continent fields was what saved the California situation.

**LOWER GRADES USED**  
It was explained that the increased gasoline production, which in May attained a record output, was due in part to the recently adopted practice of utilizing lower grades of oil in gas.

The rationing system on the coast also affected materially the consumption figures for that region. Improved refining

machinery is being used to enlarge the supply of gasoline.

Charges that a so called "gasoline ring" in California was deliberately restricting production and distribution of gasoline have been publicly retracted by the parties who lodged the complaint, Dr. White stated.
