

METEOR REPORTED FALLEN NEAR BEND

Bend, Aug. 24.—That a meteor of enormous size must have fallen in the vicinity of Bend at an early hour Monday morning, producing a terrific explosion, is the theory given by many who were awakened at 2:30 a. m. by the noise.

A majority of the residents of Bend and for a distance of 10 miles around the city were awakened by the thundering report. Persons who were out of doors at that hour say that the heavy report was preceded by a flash in the sky, accompanied by a noise resembling an airplane in flight. Buildings were shaken and windows broken at places near to the report. Investigations have not revealed where the meteor fell, but it is thought to have fallen about seven miles southeast of Bend.

P. & E. RAILROAD TO BE AUCTIONED

Medford, Aug. 24.—Under orders from the United States court, the Pacific & Eastern railroad will be sold to the highest bidder at auction Tuesday afternoon by Robert F. Maguire, special master appointed by the court.

Great interest is felt throughout the state among the timber men and in railroad circles, in this sale, and there is intense interest in Medford and the towns along the railroad, which runs between here and Butte Falls, as much of their future development depends upon the operation of this road, which has been closed more than a year.

Rumors are that there will be several bidders and M. D. Olds of Cheboyagan, Mich., who during the past year has been buying up large timber holdings along the railroad route, is generally regarded as a possible purchaser. At least one big sawmill project for Medford depends on the operation of this road.
