

# LIQUOR RAID, WITH GUN PLAY, ENDS IN HASTY MARRIAGE

Bend, Or., Aug. 24.—Seizure of a moonshine still, confiscation of liquor and arrest of the alleged proprietor of the distillery, effected near Grand View, Or., Sunday, was accompanied by a gun play, exhibition of private grudge, and impromptu marriage as a sidelight, in which the accused was the bridegroom and the captured still the background for the nuptials.

Adding modern romance to the strange succession of events in the confession of the man under arrest that he had refused an offer of \$500 from a movie film operator to pose with the still in operation.

## LIQUORS ARE SEIZED

The still was raided by State Special Agent Cassidy, resulting in the confiscation of 60 gallons of corn and rye whiskey, a still of copper, and other equipment, together with a large amount of mash, and the arrest of Roscoe Lane, the alleged manufacturer of moonshine which has been flooding Bend and vicinity for the last nine months.

The authorities are searching today for more wet goods, believed to have been cached near the head of Fly creek, 23 miles west of Grand View, where the still was found.

Lane, who led the state and county officers to the still after his arrest in Grand View, is said to have made a complete confession, involving operations extending over the past nine months, and to have taken entire responsibility.

## COUPLE MARRIED

As a sequel to the affair, Lane pleaded guilty in Madras to the charge of having liquor in his possession and was fined \$100 and given a 10-day jail sentence.

A few hours afterward, Lane and Mrs. Jane Sawyer of Bend were married in the office of Sheriff Ira Holcomb, the ceremony being performed by the Rev. Mr. Walker of the Madras Presbyterian church, while bride and groom stood beside the recently captured still.

Accompanied by Wilbur Nance, a rancher near Grand View, Lane drove into Grand View, where they were met by the special agent, Sheriff Holcomb and Deputy Jackson.

Both suspects were armed, and while Cassidy wrestled with Lane for the possession of the latter's revolver, Nance drew his weapon, but felt the muzzle of Jackson's gun against his head and took no further part in the contest.

Gilbert Nance appeared on the scene, armed with a shotgun, and was about to fire on Lane to satisfy a personal grudge, Cassidy reports, when the special agent, who had disarmed and handcuffed his man, forced him to lower his weapon.

## STILL IS FOUND

After considerable argument, Cassidy persuaded Lane to guide the authorities to the still, which was dismantled and taken into Madras. He stated that Lane informed him that the whiskey-making outfit had cost him \$700 and that he had \$500 worth of high proof liquor cached away.

Thirteen 50-gallon barrels of mash were found near the still, with two quarts of single distilled liquor.

"worm," was piped from a mountain stream.

Search at the Nance place revealed five quarts hidden in a small pile of hay, and later 60 gallons of double distilled whiskey was found on the ranch. The Nances professed entire ignorance of the location of the whiskey. In the confession, which Lane is said to have made to the authorities, Wilbur Nance is mentioned as working for wages for the alleged moonshiner.

**REFUSES \$500**

Lane is said to have been offered \$500 by a moving picture company for the privilege of filming the still in operation. He refused the offer, fearing that the risk of exposure might be too great.

The special agent ascertained in his preliminary investigations that corn in one half ton lots had been coming to Lane. A federal charge will be preferred against the prisoner, he says.

He also says that Lane served 6 years and 8 months of a 10 year sentence at the federal prison at Atlanta, Ga., for shooting a deputy sheriff and a United States deputy marshal who had been investigating his alleged moonshining activities in North Carolina.

Lane appeared in the Bend police court, through his attorney, a few weeks ago, when he pleaded guilty to having liquor in his possession, in order to regain possession of a liquor laden auto which had been seized by the authorities three weeks before.

Information that liquor was being manufactured in Jefferson county was first secured nine months ago by Sheriff J. E. Roberts of Deschutes county. Jefferson county authorities were notified at the time, but had been unable to locate the still.

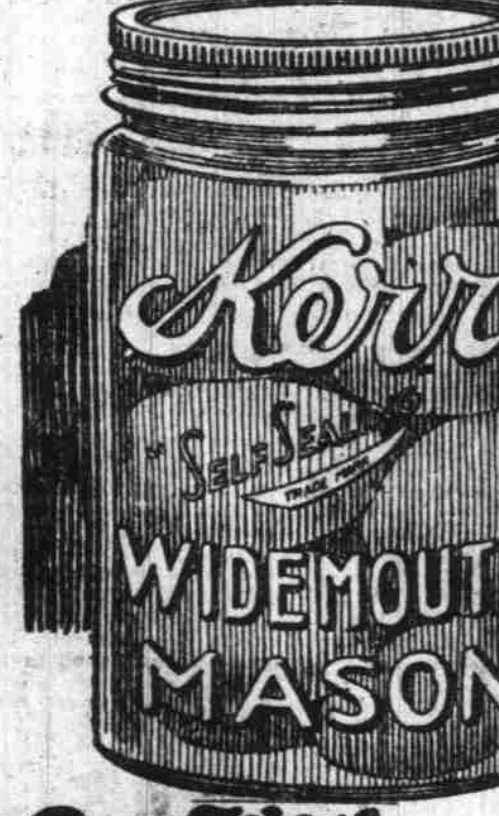

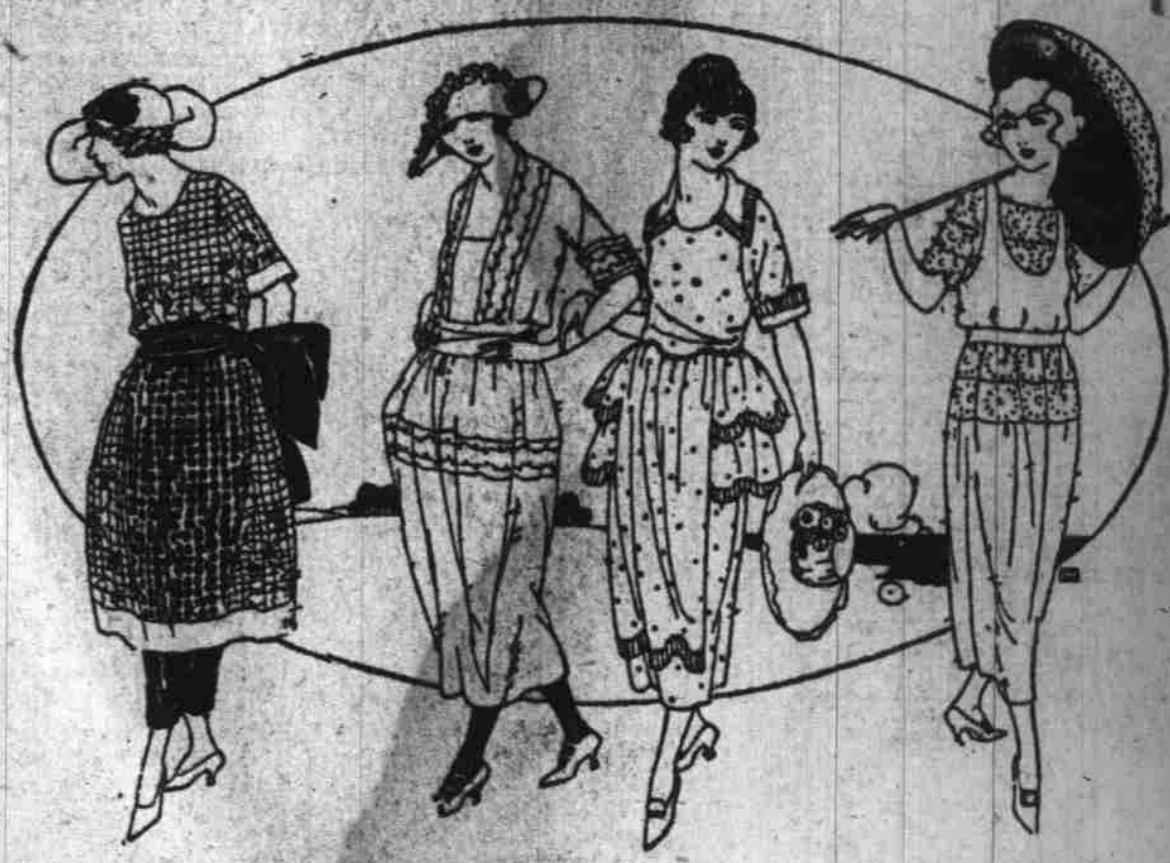
