

SCHOOL CHILDREN OF OREGON ARE TO BE TAUGHT SAFETY

Salem, Aug. 27.—Under a plan of action adopted at a conference here Thursday afternoon, Oregon will be the first state in the Union to institute a "safety first" campaign as a part of the course of study in its grade schools, according to Hugh H. Herdman of Portland, vice president and general manager of the Oregon and Columbia basin division of the National Safety Council.

Present at the conference besides Herdman were: B. C. Ball of Portland, president of the Oregon division of the national safety council; William A. Marshall and Will T. Kirk of the state industrial accident commission; A. C. Gram, state labor commissioner, and J. A. Churchill, state superintendent of public instruction.

A committee, of which Herdman will act as chairman, will begin at once the work of compiling the course of instruction on "safety first" which will be taught in connection with civics throughout the eight grades of the grade schools of the state and will cover not only the prevention of accidents but also the prevention of fires. "The industrial accident commission, state labor bureau and the state fire marshal's office will cooperate in the work," declared Herdman.

"Of the accidents occurring in industry today, not more than 25 per cent are preventable through safety appliances; the other 75 per cent must be avoided through education," declared Herdman.

Statistics were produced by Herdman to show that in Oregon alone this last through accidents in 1919 amounted to the equivalent of two and a half years of idleness on the part of a crew of 1000 men. Oregon last year alone lost out a total of \$2,119,725 in compensation for 21,379 accidents, many of which could have been prevented. It is expected that the new "safety first" course of study will be ready for distribution by January 1.

The Southern Pacific company having "closed its files" to any consideration of the leading facilities at Newberg, the public service commission Thursday, on its own motion, proceeded to open the files for the company by instituting a formal investigation into complaints registered by logging companies at Newberg.
