

INJUNCTION IS GRANTED AGAINST HOLMES GAP ROAD

The question of making permanent the injunction against the state highway commission restraining it from constructing the west side Pacific highway by way of Holmes gap and Rickreall in Polk county, came up for hearing Monday before Circuit Judge McCourt, who granted the temporary injunction.

A new feature in the case was the intervention of the Yamhill county court which joined with the state highway commission in the petition for the dissolution of the injunction.

On the part of Yamhill county it is alleged that it has made its plans based on the Holmes gap location. If a new route is chosen it would involve the financing of another grade, which the county is not in a position to do.
