TIMBER OPERATOR EXPIRES SUDDENLY

Coleman H. Wheeler, wealthy timberman and stockholder and officer in the Wheeler Lumber company of Wheeler, Or., died at his residence, 415 Montgomery Drive, from hemorrhages due to high blood pressure, at 8:30 Saturday evening. For several years the prominent timber operator had suffered from the effects of high blood pressure, terminating in the death Saturday after an acute illness of less than two hours.

LUMBER MANUFACTURER EXPIRES SUDDENLY

For many years Wheeler had been one of the big timber operators of the Columbia river district. Born in the province of Ontario, Canada, in 1865, he came to Michigan at the age of 16 and drove logs in that state. He saved a few hundred dollars and went to Tacoma, where he was employed in the logging industry for a year. Hearing of the unurveyed timber lands south of the Columbia river, Wheeler moved to Oregon, where he surveyed much of the timber land on the upper Nehalem river and located many homesteaders in that country.

WINDOW CLEANER IS DEAD FROM INJURIES

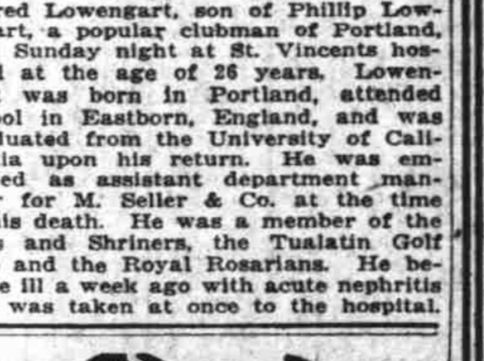

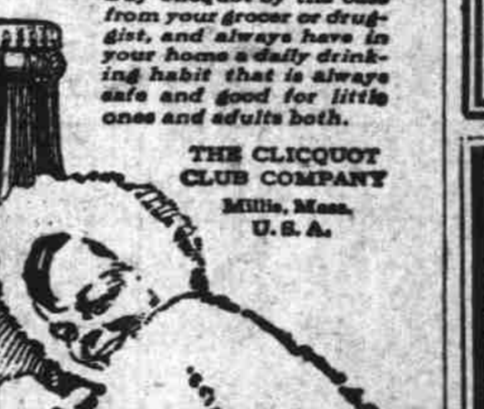

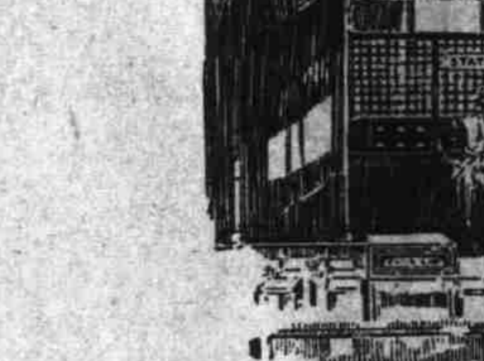
