

WINDOW CLEANERS REQUIRED TO USE SAFETY DEVICES

Commissioner A. L. Barbur of the department of public works has received a communication from the attorney general of Oregon holding that the state industrial accident commission is responsible for the enforcement of laws protecting window cleaners and compelling them to use safety devices.

Following several serious accidents to window cleaners recently, the department of public works was called upon to make an investigation and fix liability, if possible.

The municipal department's employees have tested safety belts in the testing plant at the city hall and have made other research, but corrective municipal legislation has not been possible because of the existing state laws.
