

CITY HAS BIGGEST LABOR DAY EVENTS IN ITS HISTORY

Labor day was probably more generally observed in Portland Monday than at any time in its history. Facing in the spectacular, because the labor organizations decided to forego the usual parade, it was still one of the most important holidays that organized labor has observed, because of the formal laying of the cornerstone for the \$280,000 Labor temple at Fourth and Jefferson streets, thus marking the culmination of the efforts of many years toward securing a permanent home for the union organizations.

Portland citizens generally took advantage of the holiday following a Sunday, for the purpose of picnics, reunions and many two-day trips. In all of the city parks and near-by resorts there were numerous picnics, some of them pretentious to the point of providing programs of music and speaking. The chief event of this character was at Council Crest, where labor union members and their families concentrated after the laying of the Labor temple cornerstone. Mount Scott park had an all-day celebration that was well attended.

TWO BIG CELEBRATIONS HELD ABOUT COOS BAY
Marshfield, Sept. 7.—Coos Bay citizens suspended all business Monday for two big celebrations, the dedication of the new Elks' temple and the observation of Labor day by the unions of the bay. There was a large attendance of out-of-town people.

The Elks celebration included a dance Monday night and in the afternoon visitors were taken for auto drives. A big lunch was served during the noon hour. The visiting Elks left for their homes on the night train. The labor unions held a big parade Monday morning and Monday afternoon the festivities were transferred to Shipson park at North Bend. The main speech of the day was made by G. O. Young, representing the American Federation of Labor. The Rev. J. Claud Black of the Episcopal church made an address. Dancing at the park pavilion continued during the afternoon and night.

LIBERTY ASSEMBLY, PORTLAND, WINS IN BIG ARTISAN DRILLS
Salem, Sept. 7.—Liberty assembly, United Artisans of Portland, was awarded first prize in the competitive drill between degree teams, the feature of Monday's program of the tri-state convention, which was staged in the Armory Monday morning. Fram and Alberta assemblies, also of Portland, tied for second place, with 90.24 points to the credit of each. A special prize was awarded to the Reedport drill team for traveling the longest distance in reaching the convention. The United Artisans chose Astoria as the next convention city.

Ivan Martin, Marion county legislator, welcomed the Artisans to Salem by opening the session of the convention. H. S. Hudson of Portland, supreme master Artisan, responding in behalf of the fraternity.

MEDFORD NAMES AVIATION FIELD FOR HERO OF WAR
Medford, Sept. 7.—Favored with clear skies and ideal weather, Medford's army aviation field was dedicated Monday afternoon, in the presence of a crowd estimated at 8000. It was christened as

"Newell Barber field" in honor of Lieutenant Newell Barber, the local high school boy who won renown and met his death while flying over the German trenches in France.

The dedicatory speeches were made by Porter J. Neff, orator of the day. President H. L. Wheeler of the Chamber of Commerce, Commander Coddling of the local American Legion post, Mayor C. E. Gates and Captain Lowell H. Smith, commander of the air forest patrol in Oregon. Gus Newbury read "In Flanders Field." Patriotic band selections were interspersed.

Then followed an air cruise of six big army DeHavillands driven by Lieutenants Goldborough, Coney and Kiel, Capt. Fowler and Gulle, and Captain Smith, all of the air service forest patrol of Oregon, the most thrilling feature of which was a parachute drop from a plane by Lieutenant Coney, the dare devil of the Oregon patrol, from a height of about 5000 feet.
