

LENROOT LEADING IN WISCONSIN VOTE FOR SENATORSHIP

Milwaukee, Sept. 4.—(I. N. S.)—Senator Irving L. Lenroot was leading James Thompson for the Republican nomination for United States senator from Wisconsin by 9878 votes at 10 o'clock today. Returns from 626 precincts out of 2379 gave Lenroot 45,289 and Thompson 35,391. Lenroot supporters are claiming his nomination by at least 20,000 votes.

Thompson had the support of Senator Robert M. La Follette. The returns received from 37 counties, many of them regarded as La Follette strongholds. In the fight for the Republican gubernatorial nomination, Roy P. Wilcox holds a slight lead over James J. Blaine, La Follette candidate.

W. H. Stafford, former congressman from the Fifth district, will oppose Victor L. Berger, Socialist, in the November elections. He won a three-cornered fight for the Republican nomination.

MASSACHUSETTS DEMOCRATS NAME WALSH FOR GOVERNOR
Boston, Mass., Sept. 4.—(U. P.)—In complete returns from the state primary yesterday showed that James J. Walsh, Democratic candidate for governor, had 32,794 votes, while Richard H. Long, another Democratic candidate, had 20,553 votes. These figures were based on returns from 969 precincts out of 1193.

Lieutenant Governor Channing Cox, Republican, was unopposed as the party's candidate for governor.

Senatorial Race Close
Reno, Nev., Sept. 4.—(U. P.)—Meager returns from yesterday's primary in Nevada, available today, gave ex-Governor Tasker Oddie a small lead over the Rev. Brewster Adams in the contest for the Republican senatorial nomination. Returns were so incomplete, however, that the result still was in doubt. Senator Henderson had no opposition for the Democratic nomination.

Warehouses Close As Protest Against Low Tobacco Price
Newbern, N. C., Sept. 4.—With 5,000,000 pounds of tobacco for American and foreign buyers on the opening day of the world's large loose leaf tobacco market, several towns in Eastern North Carolina closed their tobacco warehouses today in protest against the low prices offered by large tobacco corporations.

MACSWINEY NOW IN COMATOSE STATE; GEORGE UNRELAXED

London, Sept. 4.—(I. N. S.)—Terence MacSwiney, lord mayor of Cork, who has been on a hunger strike for 27 days, was in a comatose condition in Brixton jail this morning.

Premier Lloyd George, in an interview given to the Daily News, indicated that he will insist that MacSwiney and the other Irish hunger strikers be kept behind the bars. "The Cork lord mayor was engaged in a general conspiracy which resulted in the death of 85 policemen and attempted assassinations of 78 others and the government certainly has a duty to perform towards its police force," the premier was quoted as saying. "It is not right to compare MacSwiney and the other Irish hunger strikers to the suffragettes who never killed anyone. If we let them out you cannot govern Ireland. Who is to govern Ireland if not the British empire? I certainly should not be responsible for the creation of an independent republic in Ireland. If we had had that during the late war the British empire might have been destroyed by Germany's submarine war. It was a tough go as it was."
