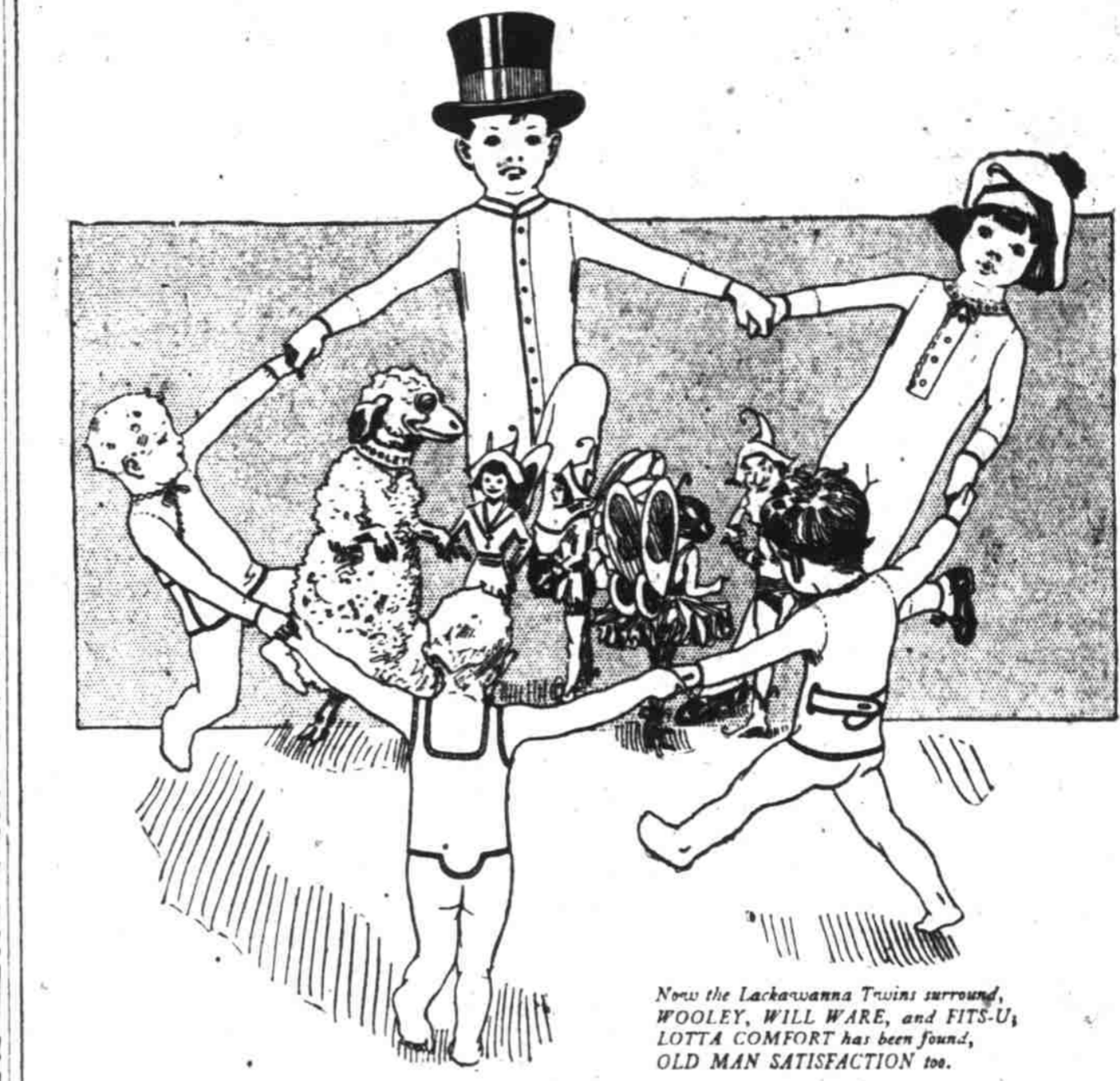
Pay Minimum Salary United Brethren Will Of \$1200 to Pastors
