

Coming Week Promises to Be Highly Important in Portland Methodist Circles

BISHOP LOCKE TO VISIT PORTLAND AFTER MANY YEARS

Bishop and Mrs. Charles Edward Locke will arrive in Portland early Sunday morning and will proceed to Wilbur Methodist church, where the bishop will preach the morning sermon. While in the city they will be the guests of Dr. and Mrs. William Wallace Youngson. Bishop and Mrs. Locke are en route to Vancouver, B. C., to sail next Thursday for Manila, where he will have Episcopal supervision of the work of the denomination for the next four years.

Bishop Locke as pastor of the First Methodist church of Portland (the old Taylor street church) from 1892 to 1897 was extremely popular. Since leaving Portland he has held important pastorates in San Francisco, Buffalo, Brooklyn and for the past 12 years in Los Angeles. Under his administration the Los Angeles church has grown to a membership of 2800, and the Centenary quota of \$250,000 was raised to \$260,000. The throngs crowded the church out of the old building, which has been sold for \$500,000. A new site has been purchased for \$340,000, on which it is


