

BODIES OF TWO PORTLAND BOYS ON WAY BACK

The bodies of two Portland men who gave their lives in service overseas have been brought back from France and are being sent to this city for burial, according to word received by J. P. Finley & Son from the war department Friday.

The bodies are those of William v.

Scott cemetery, in the plot for war veterans, and services will be in charge of the American Legion. Schleiher was killed in a railroad accident in France on March 15, 1919. His mother, Mary Elizabeth Beir, and two sisters, Mary Leah Black and Mrs. Margaret Kinney, reside in Portland. He is also survived by four brothers.

Pinkham, a Portland boy, was graduated from Lincoln high school and later passed through the University of Oregon, being graduated in 1911. He was a popular football star at Oregon and was mentioned as an All-American.

After being graduated, Pinkham entered the United States general land office as a surveyor, and was working in Idaho when the call to arms came.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. L. H. Pinkham, now in Spokane, and his grandmother, Mrs. Abbie Pinkham, are the only surviving relatives.
