

The latest freak discovered is a mouthless fish

Columbia slough was its home until a seine of the fish and game commission dragged it up from its watery haunts this morning.

John Gill, who is authority on fish science, declares the fish to be a hybrid between a sucker and a carp. The slough has long been the home of small, freakish fish, but never before was one found without a mouth. A small opening below the eyes evidently served to suck nourishment through. The fish is too slender for a carp, being more the shape of a sucker. The fins are characteristic of the carp and the markings and color

The eyes are neither carplike nor uckeresque, but are sunken inward. The




