## CUBE BUTTER NOW OFFERED FOR LESS

**EGG BIDS EXCITED.**  
For Monday arrivals f. o. b. buyers are offering up to 65¢ a dozen Portland for current receipts of eggs.

While the local consumer interests continue to talk about a good healthy tone in the fresh butter market, and especially for cubes, it is quite noticeable that extra can be purchased at lower prices from the very people who are talking of the higher figure.

Portland has been an anxious offer of cube extra butter during the last 24 hours. Some of the larger retail houses have been offered the stock down to 60¢ per pound. The demand appears scarce.

In the meantime there have been no disposition whatever among the butter men to allow the consumer to participate in this and the result is an absence of any movement for the moment.

Country creamery offerings have continued to gain and it is almost impossible to sell supplies at satisfactory value.

## DEMAND FOR EGGS VERY HEAVY

Outside demand for eggs of best quality continues to grow and f. o. b. bidders continue to offer up to 60¢ a dozen for current receipts. Local trade is mixed with much cold storage stock being sold.

## LIGHT HEN MARKET TO PEAK

Market for light weight hens is rather top-heavy at this time along Front street. Liberal supplies are being carried over into the Monday trade. Demand for heavy hens and light weight springs is good.

## LOW PRICES RULING FOR GARLIC

Kast is inquiring for local garlic but California is said to be offering carload lots around 7¢ a pound. It is not believed that much more will be available for the Oregon product, although much better.

## DEAD HOGS RULING DULLER

Country killed hogs showed extreme dullness at \$4.25 the 4-pound for good stuff but it was hard to force a movement. Veals were slightly firmer at 23¢ ½¢, the latter in a normal way.

## TOMATO PRICES ARE ADVANCED

Good quality tomatoes showed a firm tone for the day. On the Farmer's market sales were shown from 70¢ 75¢ a box for the best while on Front street limited business was done around 90¢ \$1.00 a box.

Cotulene is up 25¢ a case. Potato market steady at unchanged prices. Fresh local onions offering; rains stop curing. Kitchen beans in liberal supply at 4¢ 6¢ pound. Apple demand extremely liberal at extreme prices.
