

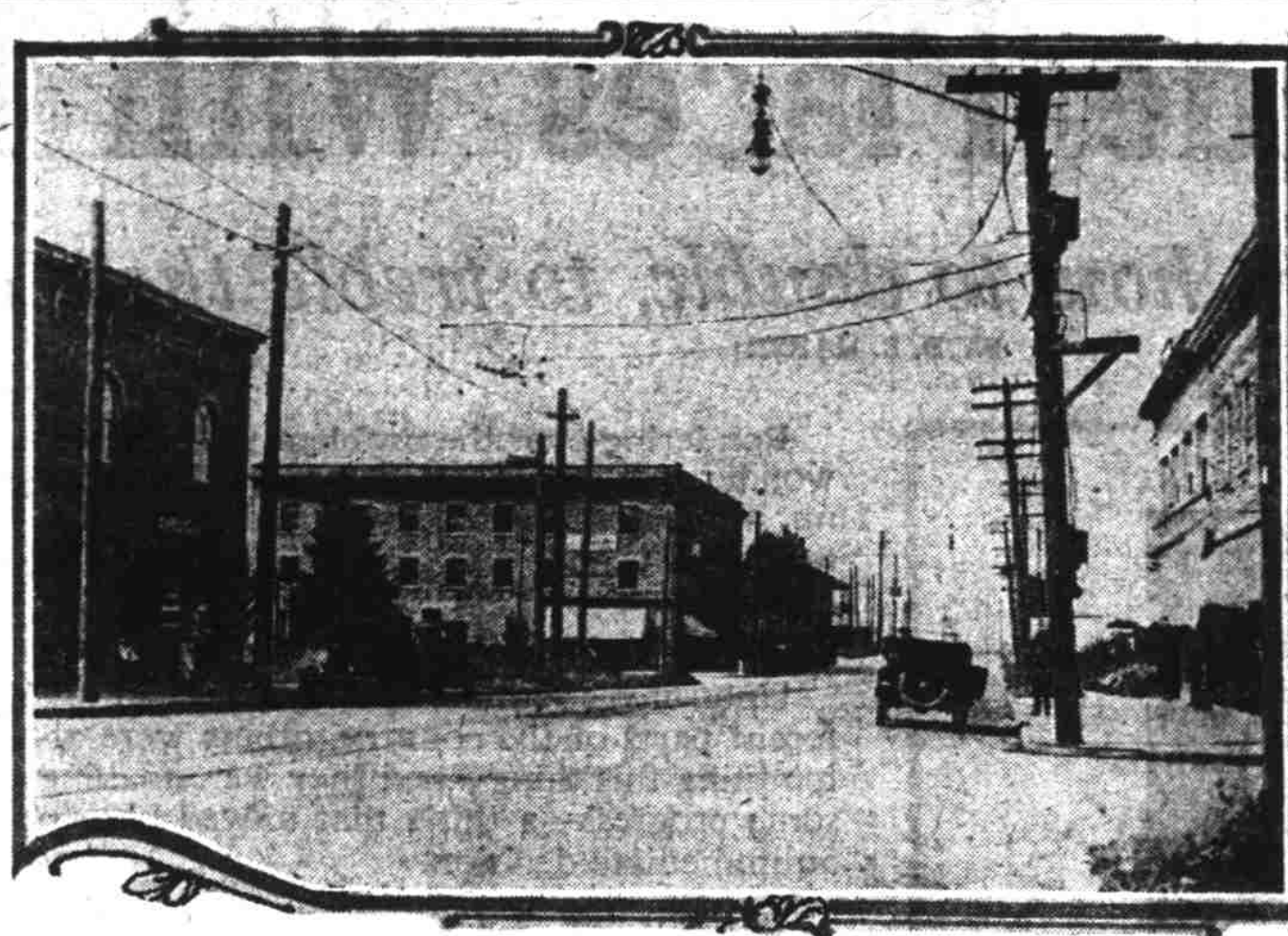

County Budget Will Permit Adequate Bridge Repair Funds Next Year

BRIDGE REPAIRING PROGRAM WRITTEN

When John Lyle Harrington, senior member of the bridge construction firm of Harrington, Howard & Ash, assured the county commissioners a few days ago that, in his judgment, there is nothing required at the Burnside bridge for the present but regulation of traffic and thorough periodical inspection of the structure, and this view was substantiated by other bridge engineers of prominence...



In the Kenton business district, which has direct outlet to the city and to the interstate bridge.

While it was estimated at this conference of bridge engineers with the commissioners that approximately \$40,000 might be the cost of required repairs on the Burnside bridge, it is the expectation of the commissioners that there will be from \$60,000 to \$70,000 available for this purpose during the coming year...

Besides the repairs that will be required on the Burnside bridge, permanent concrete approaches for the Hawthorne bridge and a biluiline flooring are contemplated at a cost of approximately \$250,000, and the regular budget allowances will be made for the maintenance and repairs of the other bridges across the Willamette river...

"We can see our way very clearly from the financial point of view," said Commissioner A. A. Muck in discussing the general bridge situation Friday night. "There were numerous appropriations required during the present year, and this will provide the way for us to take care of the bridge matters without going outside the regular budget."
