

HYDRO-ELECTRIC EXPOSITION PLANS GIVEN IMPETUS

Portland in 1925 or sooner may be the scene of a world hydro-electric exposition.

A celebration of the completion of the Lincoln and Pacific highways is projected in connection with the exposition.

The suggestion had its origin in the Columbia Hydro-Electric league which for a year has been holding meetings in the Central library. But already the exposition has been the subject of approving action and committee appointments by the Chamber of Commerce.

The organization engaged in developing and marketing the hydro-electric power of the Northwest will cooperate. It is proposed that Portland ask the cooperation of Los Angeles, San Francisco, San Diego, Tacoma, Seattle and Spokane in giving the exposition genuine world significance.

Tentative plans include the assembling of modern electrical devices for power, light, chemistry, industry and transportation from every corner of the world. That exhibits should be shown in operation is suggested as a way to lend unique animation to an exposition which will be the first of its kind.

Remarkable electrical illumination and startling electrical effects are proposed. The year 1925 has been suggested for the exposition because in 1925 will be celebrated the 125th anniversary of the invention of the electro-magnet, the heart of all industry employing electricity in any form.

Bigelow Opposed to Proposed Bill for Dock Consolidation

City Commissioner Bigelow is on record as opposing the proposed dock consolidation bill, a measure on the November ballot, in most emphatic terms. He refused to vote for adoption of a measure at a special meeting of the city council which would submit a charter amendment to the voters enabling the council to transfer dock properties.

The measure was introduced so the council would be prepared to act according to the wishes of the people, providing the consolidation bill was passed at the election. It had no powers otherwise.

Mayor Baker and other commissioners favored the measure on the ground that if the people adopted the initial act, the council should be prepared to act in a manner correlated with the voters' wish. The bill on the ballot is nullified within three years unless action of the council is taken to provide the transfer. Action on the measure was put over until Monday next.

Cox 29, Harding 5, Result of Ballot At Labor Meeting

Governor James M. Cox received 29 votes to a total of five for Senator Harding in a straw vote taken at the Thursday night meeting of the Central Labor council. Eugene Debs, Socialist, won 27 votes.

The council heard Mrs. Josephine Colby of Fresno, Cal., field secretary of the American Federation of Teachers. Mrs. Colby spoke on the proper education of children.
