

CHINESE SCURRY OUT IN NIGHTIES AS FLAMES SPREAD

A Chinese nightgown parade was staged at 4:57 a. m. today, when a fierce fire broke out at Second and Oak streets in the Hoy Sun Low restaurant on the second floor. Damage is estimated at \$15,000.

A defective flue leading from the kitchen range set fire to the grease covered walls in the kitchen, and the room was soon a mass of flames.

Chinese sleeping in the quarters discovered the fire about 4:30 a. m. and fought the blaze for about 25 minutes before the fire department was notified. When firemen of engine 21 and chemical 1, stationed across the street in the police building, answered the alarm, they could not control the fire. They called engines 1, 2, 22, and trucks 1 and 2, and all fought the blaze for over an hour. After destroying the kitchen and store

room, the fire spread through the walls to the third floor into the Chinese Free Mason headquarters and damaged this room.

The following Chinese merchants suffered heavy losses from water damage: Pook Hang Lung & Co., Hong Hing Co. and Wah Sing Yuen Co.

About the time the fire was extinguished, an alarm was sounded at the Starr Fruit Products company, 221 East Yamhill street. Fire Marshal Grenfell says smoker's carelessness was responsible for the fire, which started on the third floor. Fire and water damage to the canned fruit is estimated at \$1000.

Postpone Dana Sleeth's Case

Trial of Dana Sleeth, who was arrested Tuesday on a charge of driving an automobile while under the influence of liquor, was postponed Thursday by Municipal Judge Rossman until October 13. The action was taken by the court at the request of the defendant, in order that he might have an opportunity to secure counsel.

Auto Toll Claims Another Victim in Mike Erceg's Death

Mike Erceg, dairyman for Columbia university, who was knocked down on the Linnton road Tuesday night by an automobile driven by Harry A. Prosser of 208 1/2 Third street, died at a hospital this morning. His skull had been fractured. It is probable that an inquest will be held.

Erceg was driving some cattle along the road when the Prosser car struck him as the chauffeur was trying to avoid hitting the cattle. Prosser took Erceg to the hospital in his machine.

Appointments Made By New Postmaster Get Confirmation

Confirmation of appointments and promotions in the Portland postoffice by Postmaster John M. Jones was received from Washington this morning. Robert L. Russell, formerly cashier, becomes assistant postmaster. Russell entered the postal service in 1908 as clerk. George H. Carr, finance clerk former-

ly, is now cashier. Carr entered the service in 1929, receiving his appointment from the Philippines.

Succeeding Carr is Percy T. Harris, formerly foreman of the postal savings section. The new foreman is Frank E. Ross, promoted from the superintendency of Arleta station. William L. Baldwin, special clerk, has been promoted to the Arleta superintendency. All promotions are effective from September 11.

Everybody Is Barred; Liquor Being Crated

Everybody save a few tried and trusted federal officials was kept out of the basement of the old postoffice building this morning. Strict orders were issued to the elevator man to take nobody down. The reason is that all the rare and choice beverages which federal officials have seized for several months back are being crated for shipment. They are to be sent to the government health bureau at Washington.

Man Weds Witness In Booze Case, but Admits His Guilt

Dan Cupid cheated the United States government out of its star witness Thursday afternoon in a liquor case, when it was announced that the witness had married the defendant. The government must prosecute William Mann, 595 East Alder street, on his own admissions. Revenue agents raided the house Tuesday and found a 50-gallon still and 50 gallons of mash. The only occupant at that time was Miss Bertha Fahey. They placed a charge of violating the prohibition law against Mann and booked Miss Fahey as a witness. When the case came up for a hearing before United States Commissioner Drake, John H. Stevenson announced that the couple had been married Wednesday, so the court could not receive her testimony. To clear his wife, Mann admitted on the stand that he owned and operated the still. He was held to the grand jury under \$500 bonds.
