SURVEYS STARTED FOR IMPROVEMENT OF WATER SUPPLY

Surveys started today by Fred M. Randlett, chief engineer of the water bureau, as a preface to the extension of water mains for fire protection in widely separated districts of the east side, are first fruits of the completion of extensions and improvements in Portland's reserve water supply. The investigations were ordered by City Commissioner Mann. The districts where additional water service is eventually to be provided include Lents, Kenton, Albina and other portions of the city. The object is to determine what extensions are needed and the best locations for mains and hydrants.

Commissioner Mann calls attention to the fact that the city now has a 16-inch water main for fire protection purposes in the Kenton district, plans for the third city conduit are well under way and the city can now store sufficient water in Bull Run lake to make such improvements for various districts at a minor cost.

Commissioner Mann lays particular stress upon the fact that St. Johns has grown rapidly and is now the home of extensive manufacturing interests. "We are informed that several new plants will be erected soon in that part of the city," says his letter of request, "and it is my desire that the water supply contribute as much as possible as an inducement to more and larger industries."

"In the Albina district it will be well to pay particular attention to the installation of permanent mains in advance of paving. Where it is at all possible we want to continue the laying of permanent mains now to avoid economic waste later."

It is expected the survey of these three districts will be completed the current month and the matter then placed before the city council.

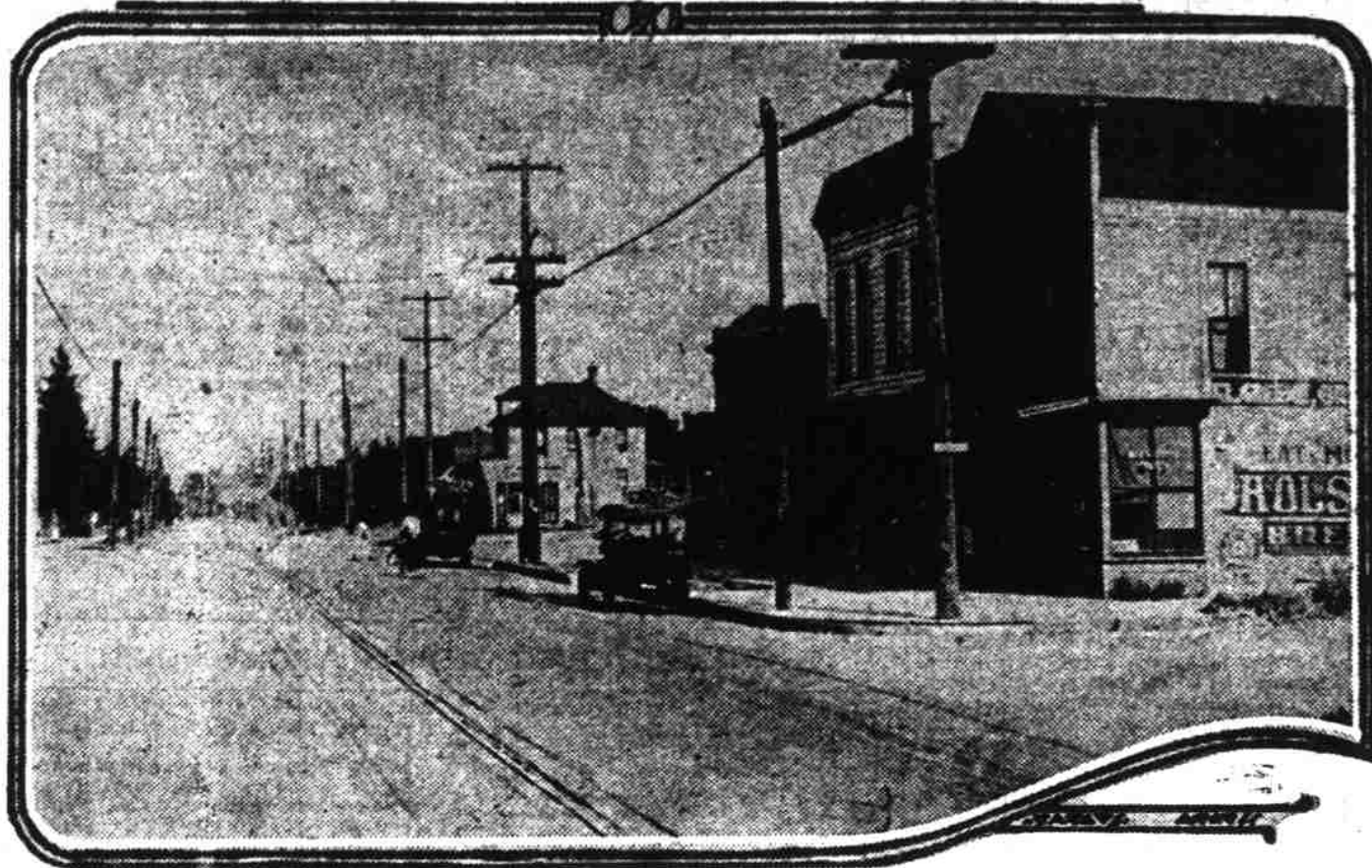

A. W. Powers, Civil War Veteran, Dies At Age of 79 Years

Andrew W. Powers, a pioneer resident of Portland died at his home in this city September 22, at the age of 79 years. Powers was born in Sullivan county, Missouri, December 26, 1841, later moved to Iowa and in 1853 crossed the plains with his parents in an ox cart, settling in Portland in that year.

In 1864 he enlisted in Company D, First Oregon Infantry, and was honorably discharged by the war department in 1868. He was a member of Reuben Wilson post No. 38, Grand Army of the Republic.

For many years Powers was a building contractor, but some years ago retired from active pursuits.

In 1873 he was married to Miss Melissa Brown, daughter of G. W. Brown, a pioneer of 1843.

Powers is survived by his widow, a daughter, Mrs. Minnie M. Golden, and two sons, George C. and Roy O. Powers, all residing in this city.
