

\$50,000,000 EACH YEAR ASKED FOR PACIFIC HARBORS

Permanent organization of the Northwest Rivers and Harbors Congress was effected at the closing session of the convention in the Multnomah hotel Tuesday evening and with provision made for annual meetings Tacoma was selected as the next meeting place.

Garret Fisher of Tacoma was selected president; Alfred A. Aya, Portland, secretary; and W. H. Clay, Everett, treasurer. One vice president was selected from each state represented, as follows: Joseph N. Teal, Portland; R. C. Beach, Idaho; Dr. G. H. Douglas, Crescent City, Cal.; and H. M. Delany, Aberdeen, Wash.

Two directors were selected from each state as follows: L. E. Bean and B. F. Stone, Oregon; E. A. Cox and Wallace Stanton, Idaho; E. F. Blaine and Clement Scott, Washington; and James McNulty and Sam Morris, California.

A policy program was adopted which advocated support for improvement of inland and coast waterways; urges federal appropriations for rivers and harbors improvement work; asks congress for \$50,000,000 appropriations for such work annually; approves the Panama canal act of 1912, and urges smaller municipalities to continue work of betterment though federal aid should be lacking.

Resolutions were adopted endorsing individually the water transportation facilities development at Portland, Vancouver, Umpqua, Everett, Tacoma, Puget Sound, Grays Harbor and Crescent City.

Resolutions were also adopted endorsing work of the schools of commerce of Oregon, Washington, Idaho and California; recommending that loose rail ends be connected up in Central Oregon; endorsing Columbia and Snake river projects and recommending congressional appropriations for a wireless station at Astoria.

The convention concluded its sessions for the year with a banquet in the Multnomah hotel at 6:30 o'clock Tuesday evening. Frank Branch Riley was toastmaster and an address on "Transportation a Factor in Northwest Development" was delivered by William Pigott of Seattle.

Political Oratory to Flood City as Speakers Warm Up

Elton Watkins will speak at the Kanton school on the League of Nations and the general political situation at 8 o'clock tonight.

Dr. E. H. Pence will deliver an address upon the moral aspects of the League of Nations at the Piedmont church tonight at 8 o'clock. At noon Thursday, Richard W. Montague, Milton A. Miller and Dr. Esther Pohl Lovejoy will speak at the Greham fair.

MAYONNAISE

2 Eggs, Yolks only
1 Pint of Mazola
1 teaspoon of Mustard
1 dash of Cayenne or White Pepper or
1/2 teaspoon Paprika

1 teaspoon of Salt
2 tablespoons each of Lemon Juice and
Vinegar or
4 tablespoons of Vinegar (any flavored
vinegar may be used)

Have all ingredients and mixing utensils cold. Mix dry ingredients. Add egg yolks and when well mixed, add 1/2 teaspoonful of vinegar. Add Mazola drop by drop until the mixture begins to thicken, beating slowly. As soon as the mixture thickens, add the remainder of the vinegar a little at a time. Now beat in the remainder of the Mazola gradually until all is used. The Mayonnaise should be thick enough to hold its shape. Put in a glass jar and cover close.
