The weather is much cooler in Oklahoma and Tennessee and on the north At-lantic ceast, and is much warmer in parts of Washington, Montana, Nebrasha and Saskatch-evant. The temperature is generally above nor-mal in the West and below normal in the East. Relative humidity at Portland: Noon yester-day. 69 per cent: 5 p. m. yesterday, 75 per cont; 5 a. m. today, 91 per cent. 
