

OLD KENTUCKY IS INVADED BY COX ON BALLOT HUNT

En Route With Governor Cox, Elizabethtown, Ky., Oct. 7.—(I. N. S.)—Governor James M. Cox, Democratic presidential nominee, today followed his annual custom of going hunting in Kentucky—but there was a difference. Instead of hunting quail, as in previous years, he passed the day hunting for votes.

Governor Cox' entry into Kentucky, signalled by a speech in this city this morning, marked the beginning of the last phase of his presidential stumping tour which was to carry him up to the state into Tennessee tonight for the speech "farthest south" at Nashville.

In the speech here Governor Cox followed his new campaign tactics of featuring the League of Nations to the virtual exclusion of all other issues, giving special prominence to the extension of international trade which he said would result as soon as foreign affairs are settled.

Glenn E. Plumb of "Plumb plan" fame accompanied Governor Cox from Columbus to Cincinnati last night and they had a long conference aboard the governor's private car. After the conference it was stated that the Plumb plan had been discussed only incidentally.

It was said that Plumb gave Governor Cox considerable information concerning the railroad situation in general

and the Cummins-Eck law in particular.

It was announced today that in all probability Cox will deliver a rear platform speech in Marion, the home of Senator Harding, when the Cox special passes through there next week.

Weygand Commands Forces of Wrangel

Copenhagen, Oct. 7.—General Weygand, chief of staff of Marshal Poch, with the French army, has now taken command of the anti-Bolshevik forces of General Wrangel, according to a report published by the National Tidende. It was General Weygand who acted as adviser to the Poles when they launched the successful counter offensive and saved Warsaw.

Under Secretary in Wilson Conference

Washington, Oct. 7.—(I. N. S.)—Under Secretary of State Davis conferred with President Wilson today for more than half an hour. Davis refused to state the subject of his discussion but it is understood that it was with reference to the preliminary work of the international communication conference which opens tomorrow.

POLES VICTORIOUS IN PEACE TREATY

London, Oct. 7.—(U. P.)—Poland has gained notable victories in a preliminary peace agreement with Russia.

The Poles gain another corridor, separating Russia and Lithuania, more territory to the east and a better transportation service. The armistice and preliminary peace agreement, effective Friday, provides for 25 days of peace with opportunity for automatic extension.

Meanwhile, fighting continued on all fronts, with the Polish troops reporting further advances to the east.

REDS CONTINUE RETREAT.

A wireless dispatch from Moscow said the Russian troops continued their retreat according to plan.

"In the Molodetchno, Minsk and Slutsk regions we captured the staff of the first Don division," the wireless said. "Three Don generals committed suicide."

A Berlin dispatch said it was reported there that General Makhno, heretofore operating against the Bolsheviks in the far southeast, had joined the Reds in fighting General Wrangel.

AGREEMENT AT RIGA.

According to the Morning Post, the agreement reached at Riga provided:

1. Hostilities will cease within six days from the signing of the agreement.

2. Both sides will withdraw to agreed lines within seven days after the armistice is effective.

3. Military and civil stores and a cer-



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tain amount of railway supplies need not be evacuated.

4. A neutral zone of 20 kilometers will be established east of the armistice line, the Poles thereby retaining all their own territory.

5. Armies must not fraternize.

6. The armistice shall be effective for 25 days.

The Morning Post regarded the terms of the agreement as a victory for Poland. The Russian delegates, it is said,

indicated great anxiety to meet the demands of the Poles.

Eugene, Oct. 7.—Enrollment in the schools in Eugene totals 2344, exclusive of students in the university high school where about 200 are enrolled. Last year the total was about 1800.

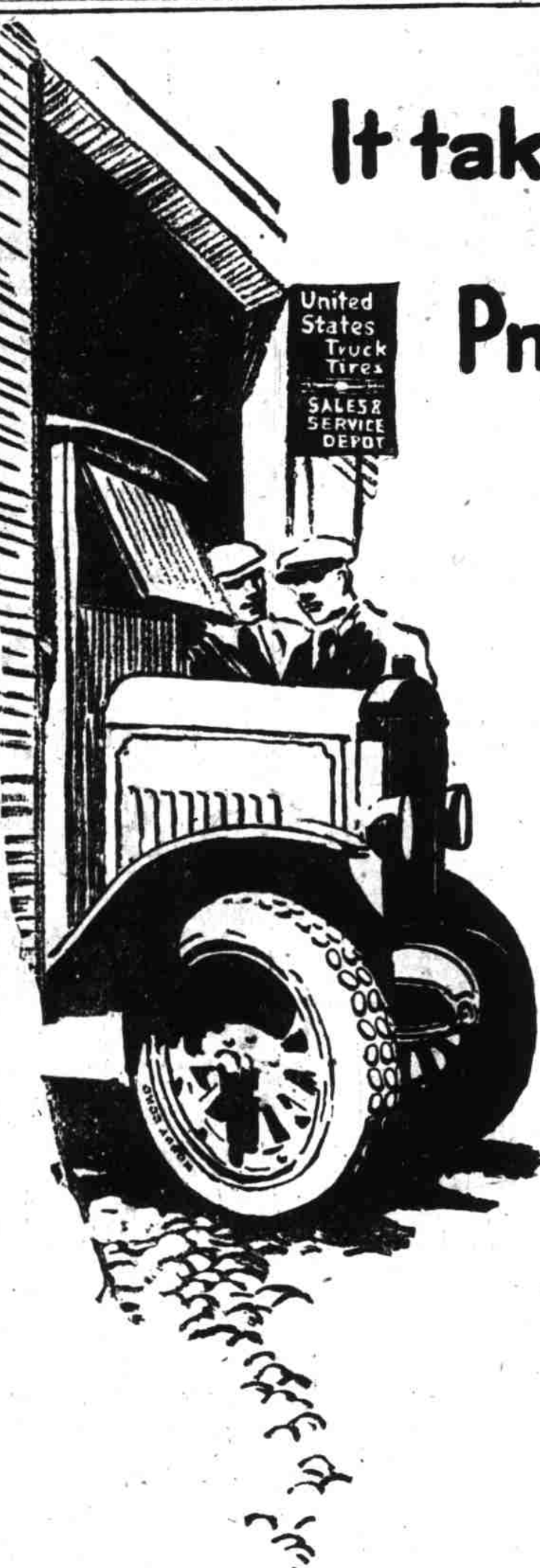
