

ONIONS-POTATOES SELLING LOWER

Both onions and potatoes are today selling at the lowest prices for several years, and consumers are likely to receive their winter's supply at no material advance over prevailing figures.

To some extent the price of onions will depend upon the extent of the damage to the Oregon crop, but potatoes show such

a big crop that there is little prospect of any high price in that line.

While Oregon Malaga and Concord grapes are showing good quality, the California stock is generally poor. Consumers should demand the local product.

There is unusually good quality shown in cranberries at this time, and the pie season is formally opened.

Pumpkins are coming forward quite freely, and they are selling at practically the same prices as previous to the war.

Chickens are in liberal demand and generally lower. Lightweight hens are cheapest per pound.

Lemons are also cheaper in the retail shops.

The following prices rule generally in retail shops for potatoes. Some of these are fractionally higher, and inferior stuff fractionally lower:

Butter—Best creamery, 65¢ @ 67¢.
Eggs—Fresh laid, 80¢ dozen; ordinary, fresh, 65¢ @ 70¢ per dozen.
Poultry—Chickens, dressed, 25¢ @ 45¢ per lb.
Fish—Salmon, 10¢ @ 20¢ per lb.; halibut, 25¢ @ 30¢ per lb.
Flour—Best local patent, \$3.00 @ 3.25 per sack, 49 lbs.
Potatoes—Burbank, 2¢ @ 3¢.
