

ONLY MEMBER OF WHITMAN PIONEER PARTY IS VISITOR

Sole Survivor of Trailbreakers
of 1843 Recalls Perils of
Settlers of Early Oregon.

John A. Stoughton, the only surviving member of the Marcus Whitman party which broke the trail across the Rocky mountains in 1873, was an interesting visitor in Portland last week. Stoughton, who is now in his ninety-first year, divides his time between Troutdale and Spokane.

Notwithstanding his advanced years Stoughton recalls with vividness some of the perils of the early trail and of subsequent explorations in the Northwest, which had hitherto known no inhabitants except the Indians.

"I was born in Westfield, Mass., and was 13 years old when we came across the plains. We escaped any serious trouble with the Indians on the trip, but for four years after we arrived were in almost constant trouble with them. My father was in the famous Whitman massacre in 1847 and I fought in the war to settle the massacre.

We settled 18 miles southwest of the present site of Portland. We had previously camped on the banks of the river where Portland now stands and Mr. Pettygrove, who was in the party, was favorably impressed with this particular spot. That he returned and founded the city that is now Portland. The farther south we journeyed the more trouble we had with Indians. They burned houses and massacred families in the Rogue river section in great numbers.

INDIANS THREATENED LIFE
"I think my narrowest escape was during a war between two tribes of Indians. One was the Kikikits. They were out after every Indian of the other tribe. One of this tribe was working with me on our farm. An old Indian hermit who lived near and whom none paid any attention to, came over to the farm and told us that the Kikikits were out after the boy and that we would not dare leave the place as they were surrounding it.

I knew my father had dug a hole under the house big enough to put a few sacks of potatoes, so we piled loose the potatoes, dropped down, and crawled over to the hole and stayed there for hours, while the Indians searched the house. Finally they left and when it got dark we crawled out and slipped out through the grass to where the horses were and by a circuitous route reached Oregon City in safety.

WHITMAN SAVED LAD
"Among the dangerous things that the early pioneers did was fording the streams. I recollect once when a lad of being saved by Dr. Whitman. He was riding a good sized horse, but I, being a child, had been given a little pony to ride. Dr. Whitman noticed that my pony was getting beyond his depth and that the current was beginning to carry us down stream and he came and heading us toward shore, guided us to safety.

Mr. Stoughton's father, A. R. Stoughton, was the builder of the first church in Oregon, the Methodist church erected in the 40's in Oregon City.
