

HASSALO IS ADDED TO RUN TO HANDLE INCREASED FREIGHT

Increasing freight business on the lower Columbia river has caused the O.W. R. & N. to place the river steamer Hassalo in service between Portland and Astoria alternating nightly with the steamer Harvest Queen. The Hassalo had been in regular service on this run during the summer, but was withdrawn in September. The first trip on the new schedule will be made Monday night by the Hassalo.

ARMY ENGINEERS ARRIVE AT COOS BAY TO INSPECT

Marshallfield, Oct. 11.—The board of engineers for rivers and harbors of the United States army, headed by Brigadier General Harry T. Taylor, arrived this morning to make an official inspection of Coos bay. The last rivers and harbors bill carried a clause for a survey to provide for the two jetties at the mouth of the bay and inside harbor work. The preliminary survey will be ordered and it will be this board which decides whether there shall be a regular survey made and later whether the improvements shall be recommended to congress. The port commissioners are taking the engineers on a tour of all the industries on the bay, and later in the day they will be taken on the tug Wilkison out over the bar. James Polhemus, civilian engineer with the Portland army engineering office at Portland, is with the party.

5284 TONS OF MOLASSES UNLOADED IN RECORD TIME

Discharging 5284 tons of bulk molasses into the tanks at terminal No. 4 in 40 hours and 50 minutes is the record set for the first big cargo of sorghum for the municipal dock. The time dated from the starting of the pumps until the delivery of the last barrel. The average run was 123 barrels per hour. Six steamships were working at terminals Monday. At No. 4 the Coast was loading outbound cargo for the Orient, the Wawona was discharging ballast, and the Montague discharging general cargo from Oriental ports. At No. 1 the West Keats and the West Katan were working cargo, and the coasting schooner Daisy Putnam worked oil and asphalt.

SCHOONER OREGON FIR IS SAFE IN MELBOURNE HARBOR

The schooner Oregon Fir is safe in the harbor at Melbourne, 77 days from the Columbia river, with a cargo of lumber. She reached the Australian port in a battered condition, topmasts and topmasts gone by the board and steering gear damaged. The Oregon Fir sailed from the river July 25, three weeks after the departure of the Oregon Pine. Both craft were bound for the same port and there was a \$500 bonus placed on the best voyage. September 6 the Oregon Pine put into Sydney with damaged steering gear and is now bound for Melbourne under tow.

ALL ALONG THE WATERFRONT

The large Griffin is due off the river Tuesday morning from Seattle. She is south-bound in tow and will load 2,000,000 feet of lumber for the West Coast. The steamship Multnomah of the McCormick line is sailing from San Francisco Tuesday and will leave for the South October 18. The steamship Wapama, Portland for San Pedro via Seattle, is due at the latter port Monday evening at 6 o'clock. The steamship City of Topeka, Admiral line, will sail from San Francisco for Portland Monday afternoon.

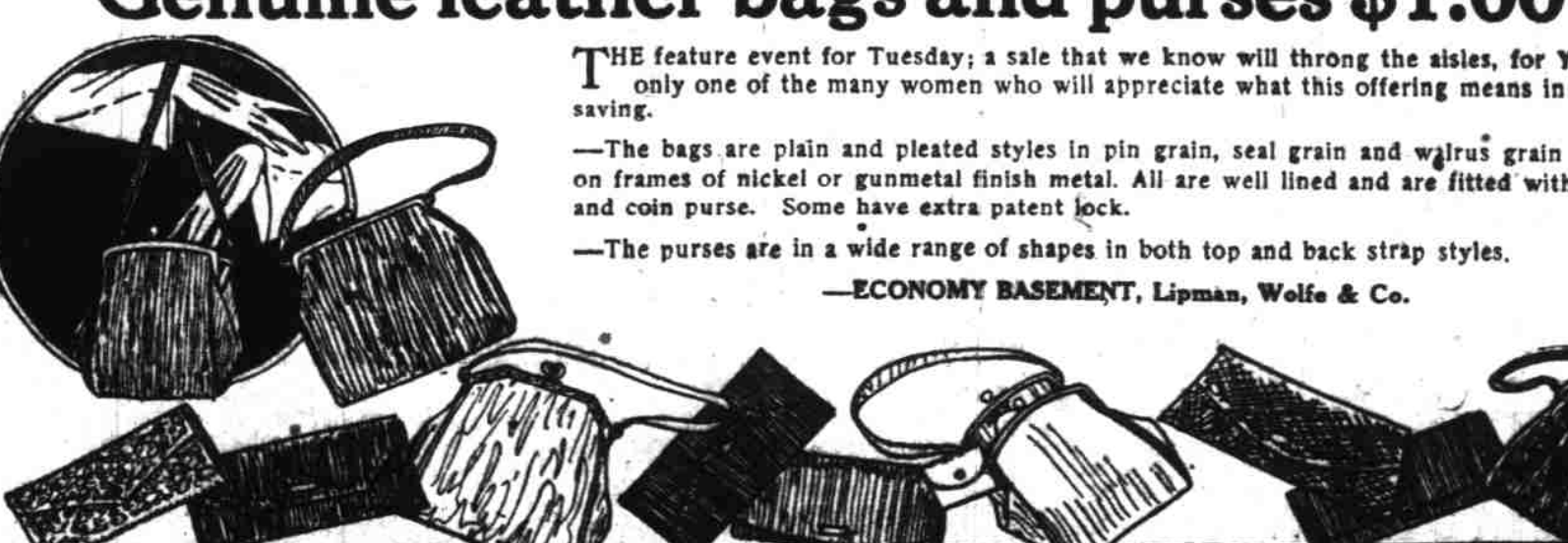
