

PORTLAND STANDS FIFTEENTH IN PORT TONNAGE REPORT

Resume of Foreign Trade in Shipping Board Boats Gives Portland Good Fiscal Year Rating.

Washington, Oct. 11.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL.)—In a resume of foreign trade carried by shipping board vessels, made public today, Portland is given fifteenth rank among the ports of the country for total tonnage for the fiscal year, amounting to 262,263 tons.

Portland stands thirteenth in exports, 248,676 tons, and twenty-fifth in imports, 13,587 tons. Seattle ranks ninth in total tonnage, 679,558 tons; ninth in exports, 536,345 tons, and tenth in imports, 143,213 tons. Tacoma ranks twenty-first in the total, with 20,207 tons; thirty-sixth in exports, 7627 tons, and twenty-first in imports, 22,580 tons. San Francisco is sixth in total tonnage, seventh in exports, fifth in imports. Los Angeles stands twentieth in the total, nineteenth in exports, twenty-third in imports.

ASTORIA EXPORTS ONLY

Astoria was one of the 18 ports showing exports only and no imports. It held twenty-fourth rank for exports, with a total of 36,244 tons. Bellingham, Aberdeen, Everett, Grays Harbor, Port Townsend and Eureka also appear with "exports only." Bellingham in twenty-seventh place, Aberdeen, Everett and Grays Harbor closely bunched at thirty-eighth, thirty-ninth and fortieth.

New York is shown to have handled nearly 28 per cent of the total tonnage, Baltimore and Philadelphia following with 10 per cent each, making nearly one half for these three ports. Twenty-six ports handled over 97 per cent of the total of 20,615,402 tons, those below Philadelphia in the order of rank being:

New Orleans, Norfolk, San Francisco, Newport News, Savannah, Seattle, Boston, Galveston, Port Arthur, Mobile, Charleston, Portland, Jacksonville, Portland (Maine), Perth Amboy (N. J.), Wilmington (N. C.), Los Angeles, Pensacola, Tacoma, Tampa, San Pedro, Houston and Key West.

It is presumed that later figures would be more favorable for Portland, because of the additional allocations and increased activity since June 30, when the fiscal year, which these statistics cover, ended.

In a resume of the Pacific coast district the board says:

"The Pacific district includes 14 ports on the Pacific coast, which forwarded 12 per cent (1,827,760 tons) of the total export tonnage. Of the district exports, San Francisco handled 37 per cent (696,500 tons), Seattle 33 per cent (536,345 tons) and Portland 15 per cent (248,676 tons). Exports of less than 100,000 tons were forwarded by Los Angeles, 96,677 tons; Port San Luis, 37,560 tons; Astoria, 24,244 tons; Bellingham, 28,795 tons; San Pedro, 18,296 tons; Tacoma, 7627 tons; Aberdeen, 4200 tons; Everett, 3879 tons; Grays Harbor, 2773 tons; Port Townsend, 2188 tons, and Eureka 1800 tons.

In imports the Pacific division received a little less than 9 per cent (637,000 tons) of the total tonnage. Of the district total imports San Francisco received 69 per cent (438,511 tons) and Seattle 22 per cent (143,213 tons). Other receipts were Tacoma, 22,580 tons; Los Angeles, 18,429 tons; Portland, 13,587 tons and San Pedro, 2775 tons. No imports arrived at Aberdeen, Astoria, Bellingham, Eureka, Everett, Grays Harbor, Port San Luis and Port Townsend.

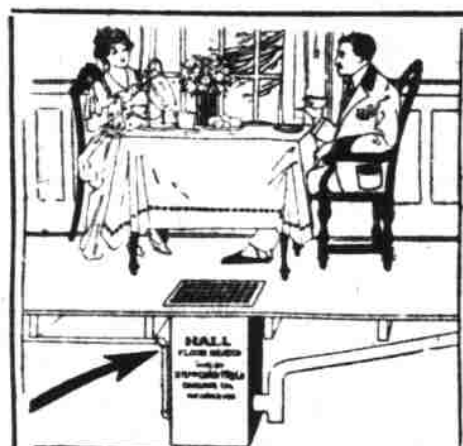

High Court Sets Aside Appeal of Alien Fisherman

San Francisco, Oct. 12.—(U. N. S.)—The federal circuit court of appeals on Monday affirmed the decree of the lower court in dismissing the bill for want of equity in the case of Charles Olin vs. Harry Klammer, Carl Shoemaker, J. N. Fleishner, Ben Olcott, C. F. Stone, Marion Jack and Frank Warren. The case involved a conflict in the Washington and Oregon fishing laws.

The circuit court of appeals also affirmed sentences of the lower court in the cases of five Seattle men charged with the theft of \$20,000 worth of liquor. Ed Carey must serve 15 months at McNeil Island, Ed Hagen two years, Jim Morrison 22 months, N. F. Patton two years and Dick Russell two years.

Charles Olin brought suit against officials of the Oregon fish and game commission, protesting its denying him a fishing license under authority of the anti-alien fishing law passed by the 1915 legislative session, providing that residents of the state who were not citizens be refused the right to fish in Oregon waters. Olin's contention was that the law violated the compact existing between Oregon and Washington and was otherwise unconstitutional.
