

THAD ROBINSON, PORTLAND BROKER, ACCUSED OF FRAUD

Charged with obtaining money under false pretenses in a land deal at Tillamook, Thad Robinson, former cashier of the Tillamook County bank, now a bond and mortgage broker of Portland, was arrested at his home, 864 Colonial avenue, Sunday morning by Deputy Sheriff Perkins of Tillamook and Chief Deputy Sheriff Christofferson of Portland. A secret indictment was served last week by the Tillamook county grand jury.

Unable to arrange for \$10,000 bail bond, Robinson was forced to remain in the county jail Sunday night. He will be taken to Tillamook Monday.

Robinson is indicted on a charge of selling 10 \$1,000 notes to two Tillamook county citizens under false representations. Robinson denied that there was any irregularity in the financial transactions with the two men. The affair can be quickly adjusted when he returns to Tillamook, he said Sunday.

Bitter at the manner of his arrest, because he was placed in jail on Sunday when it was virtually impossible to arrange bail, Robinson said that his accusers would be exposed on his return to Tillamook. He branded the affair as a frame-up.

Robinson said that he had been a banker for 20 years and this is the first time that he has been accused of any irregularity in business transactions.

"I purchased 160 acres of alfalfa land which laid within a government irrigation project. I sold this land to 12 men who wanted to get hold of some alfalfa land. They paid \$2,000 to me in cash and gave me 10 \$1,000 notes to insure payment of the balance. I sold the notes, but guaranteed the payment to the two men who bought them," he said.

"A corporation cannot acquire title property in an irrigation district until the indebtedness is cleared. The group of men who bought the land understood this perfectly.

"The purchasers of the notes have my written assurance that the notes will be paid. I am financially able to pay off the \$10,000 even if the corporation does not."

Dr. G. C. Basset of Reed Gives Talk on Vocational Aptitude

Reed college should serve the community to the limit of its capacity, according to Dr. G. C. Basset, psychologist, in an assembly talk. Oregon Guard Will Be Instructed in Extension Courses

Military engineering, civil engineering and electrical engineering are to be taught in an extension course to members of the Fifth regiment, Oregon National Guard. Announcement of this special feature of the winter work was made Saturday by Captain George E. Sandy, who has arranged a series of lectures at the Portland Armory and a general plan whereby the enlisted men of the guard will be able to obtain a col-

lege certificate from the Oregon Agricultural college.
The course will include 10 lectures to be followed by other instruction, after which examinations will be held. The lecture course, under the direction of the Oregon Agricultural college, is as follows:
October 23, "The Military Sketch Board," by Professor Stuart Sims; November 13, "Military Sketches and Maps," by Professor Sims; December 10, "Military Roads," by Professor Gordon V. Skelton; January 7, "Camp Sanitation," by H. S. Rogers; January 23, "Supplying a Military Camp With Water," by H. S. Rogers; February 13, "Direct Current and Applications," by Professor R. H. Dearborn; March 11, "Alternating Current and Applications," by Professor Dearborn; April 1, "Storage Batteries and Field Telephones," by Professor J. H. Belknap; April 22, "Radio Communication," by Professor L. F. Wooster; May 13, "Steam Engines and Boilers," by Captain George E. Sandy.

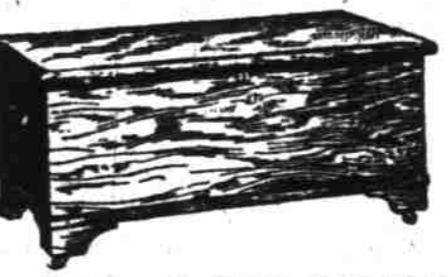
