DR. J. H. WELLS ADDRESSES LANG SYNE SOCIETY

The roll call of members of the Lang Syne society at a luncheon held Wednesday at the Benson hotel, which was responded to by name and the date of arrival in Oregon, gave Judge M. C. George the distinction of being the first among those present to arrive in the state.

The one thing that saddened the meeting of these pioneer business men was the vacant chair draped in memory of James F. Pailing, one of the most prominent members and a former officer and director, who died Monday.

The principal speaker was Dr. J. Hunter Wells, who recently returned from a 22 year's service as medical missionary in Japan. Dr. Wells presented arguments against the great freedom granted to Japanese in this country, declaring that no such privileges are extended to foreigners in Japan and that it cannot be denied that every Japanese holds the firm expectation of returning to Japan as soon as he has accumulated a sufficient number of American dollars.

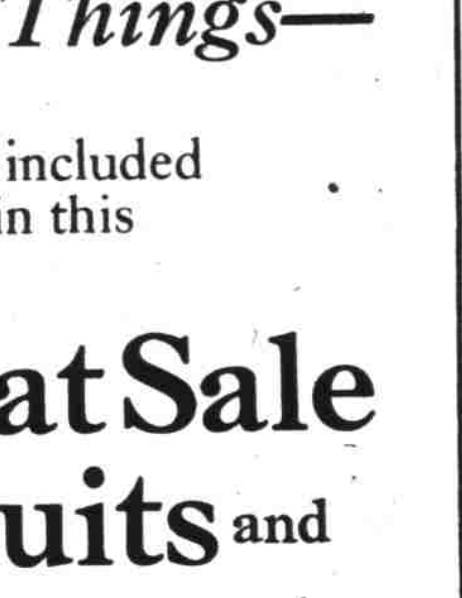
